## City student to attend Naval Academy

Jensen Boyt, a Shafter High senior, will be attending the Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland.

It has been over a little over 20 years since a Shafter High School student had been nominated to one of the nation's mili-

tary academies. The last student was Eli Espericueta, who graduated from West Point in 2000.

Boyt was originally nominated by Congressman TJ Cox and went through the process of applying to local congressmen,

interviews and applications. He received the call from Congressman David Valadao with the news that he had been accepted.

"I have wanted to be in the Navy since grade school," said Boyt. He will be attending the Naval Academy and will then serve at least a five-year commitment with the Navy. Currently, Boyt said that his dream is

to become a Navy SEAL.

Considered one of the most challenging programs in the nation, Boyt said that he realizes what challenges he is facing and is looking forward to meeting them.

"Becoming a SEAL is such an honor and something that I have dreamed about for a

## City awarded \$2.2M grant for park

The city was recently awarded an Urban Greening Grant for \$2.2 million for the Central Avenue Neighborhood Park, City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez told the City Council.

Ortiz-Hernandez reported that the Natural Resources Agency announced \$28 million was funded in the Urban Greening Program grants.

The grant provides funding for projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and provide multiple benefits including expanding access to parks and green spaces in underserved areas across the state.

Ortiz-Hernandez said the funding is available to convert built environments into green spaces, such as replacing asphalt with native plants, pollinator gardens and nature-based outdoor play areas or constructing new commuter paths to reduce vehicle miles traveled. The grant is funded by Cap-and-Trade revenues, also known as the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund.

"Access to the outdoors for all Californians is more important than ever," said California Natural Resources Secretary Wade Crowfoot. "Time spent in parks and amidst trees improves our physical and mental health and enhances our wellbeing. Unfortunately, too many Californians live in communities without green spaces and tree cover. The

On Saturday, April 17, Wasco's Taco Bell gave away free crunchy tacos to the first 200 customers of the day at its drive-thru window.

The lobby was closed to customers. Construction workers are finishing up the interior remodeling.

The construction crew was painting the inside and working on the redesigned interior counter and seating area, which will offer free WiFi to customers.

The new flooring and painted walls spruces up the restaurant. The tables are safely spread apart to ensure safe distancing. Customers must wear a mask upon entering the restaurant.

Taco Bell is owned by Cotti Foods.

Cotti Foods Corporation is located in Rancho Santa Margarita. The company owns and operates 85 Taco Bells, 107 Wendy's and 5 Pieology restaurants in the United States.



New floors and seating have been safely spaced in the upgraded dining area.

Their story began in 1967 with the purchase of a Taco Bell by Peter Capriotti, Sr. Capriotti's son, Peter, purchased his first restaurant in 1982 and began the same tradition. The father and son joined forces in 1996 and created Cotti Foods.



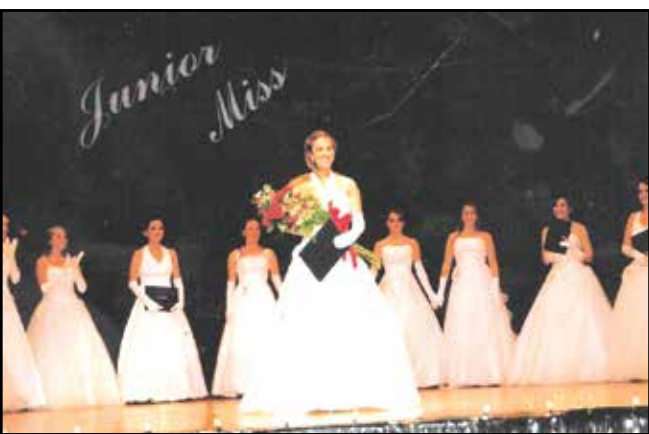

# City native makes history as part of cryptocurrency company

The city's 2005 Junior Miss Julie Strauss is part of the first cryptocurrency company to go public on the stock market.

Strauss, a 2006 graduate of Shafter High School, is a member of the Coinbase team in the San Francisco Bay area. Her team

marked a milestone last Wednesday as their photos flashed on the Times Square Nasdaq Jumbotron.

Strauss is the Global Head of Enterprise Risk and Controls of the company. Coinbase operates a cryptocurrency exchange platform and their stock was made available to the public for the first time last week. Coinbase is the first cryptocurrency company to go public and is considered by one publication as one of the biggest IPOs in history.

Strauss said that their ultimate goal is to make cryptocurrency the norm in the world.

"We are excited to bring cryptocurrency to the country and show

that it really is the future," she said.

Strauss said that it was surreal to see her likeness on that screen.

"A small town girl from Shafter with her face at Times Square, it was really incredible," she said.

Strauss graduated from high school and then headed to Texas Tech where she received her Bachelor's degree in business administration. She then attended Cal State Bakersfield to get her degree in economics.

Strauss said she got into cryptocurrency when she worked for a company in Fresno. She then moved to San Francisco and became the head of the Risk and Controls Department of Coinbase. She said that she would not have been able to accomplish what she has without her background and experience at Shafter High School.

"I can't thank my teachers at Shafter High School enough for instilling that knowledge in me, as well as a good work ethic," Strauss said.

She said another reason for her success is the small town farming community that she grew up in.

"We were farmers who were brought up and taught how to work hard and what that hard work can do," said Strauss.

She makes it back to Shafter every couple of months and will also be speaking at a summer session at the Shafter Learning Center.

"I want to show the kids that no matter where you come from, you can go as far and be as big as you want to be," concluded Strauss.

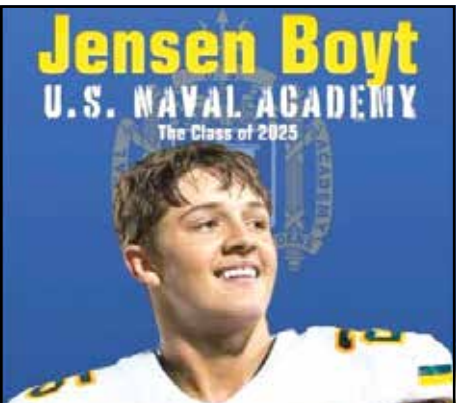

On April 13, 2021, the Kern County Board of Supervisors enacted Franchise Ordinance F-664. Franchise Ordinance F-664 granted CalBioGas Buttonwillow LLC (“Grant-ee”) a 20-year non-exclusive franchise to construct, install, maintain, inspect, operate, repair, renew, and remove non-public utility pipelines together with the appurtenances and equipment necessary or convenient for operation thereof. The actual external diameter, including casing, rounded to the closest inch, shall not exceed 13 inches. The principal purpose of the franchise is the transporting of natural gas in and under any and all public highways, roadways, or streets, now or hereafter dedicated to public use for roadway purposes and expressly accepted and/or declared public highways by the County (in-

cluding, but not limited to, the Kern County right of way for Scofield Avenue, Riverside Street, Magnolia Avenue, Seventh Standard Road, and Brandt Road), which are within the County of Kern, and within Sections 13 and 24, Township 28 South, Range 23 East, M.D.B.M., Sections 28, 29, and 33, Township 27 South, Range 24 East, M.D.B.M., Sections 4, 9, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 22, 23, 24, 27, and 34, Township 28 South, Range 24 East, M.D.B.M., and Sections 2, 3, 4, 10 and 11, Township 29 South, Range 24 East, M.D.B.M., but not included within the limits of an incorporated city. Throughout the term of the franchise the Grantee and its successors or assigns shall pay to the County an annual franchise fee equivalent to \$1.55 per cubic foot for each of Grantee’s pipelines installed in County right of way. Fees shall be calculated by using the actual external diameter, including the casing, rounded to the closest inch, of each pipeline. This franchise fee shall be adjusted annually, pursuant to Section 7 of the Ordinance. Grantee shall file with the designated agent of the Board of Supervisors, within three months after the expiration of the calendar year or fractional calendar year following the date of the granting of the franchise and within three months after the expiration of each calendar year thereafter, a detailed and verified statement showing the location (by road name or number and section, township and range), length (expressed in feet) and size (expressed in inches) of all of Grantee’s pipelines situated within the County right of way. Grantee shall pay to the County, within 15 days after the time for filing the statement described hereinabove, in lawful money of the United States, the annual fee due. Any neglect, omission or refusal by Grantee to file the verified statement, or to pay the franchise fee at the time or in the manner provided, shall make the Grantee subject to penalties and/or constitutes grounds for declaration of forfeiture of the franchise and of all rights thereafter, as detailed in Sections 11, 13, and 14 of Ordinance F-3 (Fourth Revision). The application of Grantee, the franchise ordinance and related documents are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, Kern County Administrative Center, where they may be examined during normal business hours.
