Quality of life ranked high in city street poll

A person-on-the-street poll of Shafter residents on their quality of life highlighted the weaknesses of random questioning.

A survey presented to Shafter City Council earlier this month by a graduate class at Cal State Bakersfield asked residents questions about the quality of life in the city,and their neighborhoods. It also asked about the quality of the public services in the city, such as the police, fire and emergency services.

The survey was highly favorable, with quality rated good and excellent in all categories.

But the surveyors noted that although the numbers showed that residents considered their quality of life in the good and excellent range, at a combined 73%, it was noted that this percentage was down six percentage points from a similar survey conducted in 2021.

Last week, a Shafter Press reporter con-





The multisensory exhibit is a mobile movie theater that allows eight visitors at a time to "experience" a violent storm through a sevenminute video, augmented by surround sound, rumbling vibrations, blowing wind and misty rain. Visitors also receive a closeup look at the raw devastation caused by a major disaster – the Greensburg, Kan., tornado – and the many MDS volunteers who helped to clean up and rebuild the

Organizers hope the eye-opening experience leads people to volunteer and help them with their projects intended to help families recover from natural disasters across the U.S.

The Storm Encounter will be present-

ed on Wednesday, May 31, at the Shafter Mennonite Brethren Church, 400 Kern St.. The event is free. The total experience is approximately 10 minutes long. There is no need to sign up.

The project was begun by Scott Hartman, director of event planning for the Mennonite Church USA, with the goal of creating a mobile display. Kevin King, executive director of MDS, said that Hartman encouraged him to develop something interactive to present at Menno-Con19, which was a national gathering of Mennonite Churches. MDS is a volunteer network of churches with a mission to respond in Christian love to those affected by disasters in Canada and the United "This is an important project," King

said. "The number of major disasters has dramatically increased and the need for assistance is growing."

stance abuse resources, psychiatric services, case management, intensified services for more severe symptoms, peer support services, trauma-informed care, group therapy, crisis services, individual and family counseling and linkage to other community agencies.

They also have a 24-hour crisis line: 877-300-4738.

She said CCS hopes to fight the stigma associated with mental health. "There are still a lot of people that don't

believe mental health is real," Ojeda said. "Some cultures think that we can just suck it up with our problems and move on."

'We are working to break that stigma by starting the conversation with people and normalizing mental health.'

One of the biggest challenges to fighting stigma, she said, is that people don't get help until they are at the point of hospitalization or crisis.

She believes mental health should be treated as any other medical diagnosis.

The message she hopes to spread to the

community is to tell those suffering in silence that they are not alone and that there are people waiting to come to them with open arms.

Ojeda said she loves her job.

"I am very passionate about helping people grow and passionate about working in this town because it is the town I grew up in."

Most of the staff is bilingual to accommodate the large Latino Spanish-speaking demographic in Wasco. "We have allocated funding for those who are not able to have insurance," she said.

There are adult and children clinics.

CCS was established more than 20 years ago with the mission to provide great care to those in need.

Ojeda encourages those struggling with mental health to reach out to CCS and schedule an assessment.

"It's the first step towards recovery."





Quality of life ranked high in street poll

ducted an informal poll on residents in the streets of Shafter, asking them some of the same questions asked by the pollsters.

Among the 40 residents talked to in the downtown area, 75% thought that their quality of life was either good or excellent, with 34% saying excellent and 41% saying that they consider their quality of life in the good range. Twenty percent of those polled said they thought their quality of life was average and 5% said it was below average.

They overwhelmingly answered positively to the service of the Shafter Police Department, with 84% saying that they consider the service good or excellent. As for the roads and maintenance of the city, overall, the city did well in this category, with 79% of those asked thinking that the state of the roads are good or excellent.

Just a couple of those polled were willing to speak on the record for publication. Of those, Liliana Rodriguez and Debra Martinez said that they consider their quality of life good. They also said that they really didn't put too much faith in polls. "It really depends on who you talk to. If you don't talk to



everyone in town, you really are just taking a small sample of the people living here," said Rodriguez.

Frank Valencia, who said that his quality of life was in the excellent category, said, "I think that Shafter is a great place to live. I used to live in Modesto, and it was just crazy up there. I feel a lot safer here and the people are very nice."

With so many of the residents that we talked to, they echoed the sentiment about the reliability of polls and surveys. "I don't mind speaking my mind, but some people might not want to say anything, especially if it is something negative against the city."

The followup poll showed it was a challenge to get residents to take part in a survey or poll, to get residents to voice their opinions. This is evident by the numbers of the study done by Cal State Bakersfield. In a city of over 20,000 people, there were only 342 residents who responded to the on-line survey, 1.8% of Shafter's population.

She asked if I could let them know how much she appreciates them for their love and support. This includes Francisco Martinez, who has started a GoFundMe web page for Carrillo.


As they were thanking me and leaving, her friend turned to her again, and said, "Yeah, this was no coincidence. This happened for a

PASTOR'S CORNER

Wise conflict resolution

PASTOR SPENCER CARPENTER Congregational Bible Church

If you desire to live in a world

without conflict, then you are living in the wrong world. The sinful nature of humanity will lead to conflicts, disagreements, and divisions. "Now the deeds of the flesh are evident ... hostilities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions ..." (Gala-

tians 5:19-20). Conflict is a serious disagreement over a difference in opinion, purpose, or preference. Conflict may be caused by misunderstandings, poor communication, different values, goals, priorities, expectations, interests, opinions, preferences, competition, and sin. Resolving conflicts so all parties are benefitted, so that relationships strengthen, so that mutual goals are accomplished, and so peace is made is a Christian character quality and skill. Such is the goal and character of a peacemaker.

Conflict is caused by fleshly lusts that come out of the desires of fallen hearts (James 4:1-2). People have unmet desires and demands that conflict with someone else's desires and demands, so conflict erupts. The cause of destructive or hurtful conflict may be rooted in a variety of sins: pride (Proverbs 13:10); anger (15:18); harsh words (15:1); impulsive reactions (25:8); being hasty and rushing (18:13); and getting involved in others business or conflicts when it will not help or was not asked for (26:17). Overall, it is vitally important for Christians to examine their own hearts to recognize any of these sins or unwise courses of action regarding conflict. Everyone reacts to conflict in

different ways, and there are three broad categories: escaping, attacking or making peace. The extreme ends are known as the fight or flight. Escaping may include denial of the problem and literally running away. Attacking may include verbal attacks, physical assault, slandering another's reputation or appealing to authorities. What is the appropriate biblical response to conflict? Making peace (Matthew 5:9; Romans 12:18). When conflict arises, the Bible has the principles necessary to resolve conflicts and to bring about peace, insofar as it depends on the

The wise Christian wants to first understand the dynamics of conflict. Clarify the main issues, desires, and sins in the conflict. What are your wants and desires? What are your demands? Are you considering the other person's wants, preferences and goals as well? What may be the sin in your heart that is causing you to cling to these desires above being humble, forgiving, generous or deferring to let the other person have what they want? Jesus' words against hypocritical judgment guide us to examine and evaluate our own hearts (Matt 7:1-5). Peacemaking and resolving con-

flict are part of who we are supposed to be as children of God: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the sons of God" (Matthew 5:9). Peace occurs when the decision is made to work out differences, to forgive and to reconcile. "A man's wisdom gives him patience; it is to his glory to overlook an offense" (Proverbs 19:11). Further steps of peacemaking involve reconciliation (Matt 5:23-24); negotiation (Phillipians 2:4); mediation (Matthew 18:16; Proverbs 15:22); arbitration (1 Corinthians 6:4); and accountability (Matthew 18:17). Remember, the goal of resolving conflicts is to achieve the best possible outcome and to maintain a loving relationship with all parties involved. "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone" (Romans 12:18); "Live in peace with each other.... Make sure nobody pays back wrong for wrong." 1 Thesselonians 5:13b-15
