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# Councilors call for Garcia to resign

Mayor Alex Garcia is being called to resign by some City Council members after his recent arrest for driving under the influence.

At the City Council meeting, council members urged City Manager Scott Hurlbert to put the possibility of removing Garcia as mayor onto a future meeting agenda.

Garcia was arrested in June by the Cali-

fornia Highway Patrol for driving under the influence. He was arraigned on June 28 and is scheduled to appear in court on Aug. 19.

Council members Tilo Cortez and Vincent Martinez said Garcia's legal issues may distract from important city business. Cortez recommended that Garcia step down as mayor.

"I would welcome that as a gesture of good faith," Cortez said.

Cortez said he has received a number of communications from community members and he feels it is his responsibility as the senior member of the council to ask that it be placed on the July 20 agenda and discussed at the next meeting.

This was not the first time that Garcia has been charged. In 2009, Garcia appeared in a Fresno County courthouse on charges of reckless driving, driving under the influence, as well as a failure in the lighting of the vehicle.

The driving under the influence charge was dismissed and Garcia pled nolo contendere to the reckless driving and remaining charges. He was ordered to pay a fine, sentenced to 90 days at the Fresno County Jail and ordered to attend a 12 Hour Alcohol Education Program.

At the City Council meeting on Tuesday night, Garcia said that because of the active case, he could not comment on the situation, but looked forward to addressing it when he is able to do so.

# Sheriff's office confiscates over 4,300 pounds of fireworks

Over 4,300 pounds of illegal fireworks were confiscated by the Kern County Sheriff's Office over the last two weeks in an undercover investigation regarding the sale and possession of illegal fireworks in the county.

The Kern County Sheriff's Office Crimes Against Persons, Special Victims Unit and Narcotics Investigations worked together on the investigation.

Deputies reported that during the Fourth of July holiday weekend, they seized a total of 4,392 pounds of illegal fireworks, as well as more than \$4,000 in currency tied to the sales of the fireworks.

Felix Romero, 42, of Bakersfield, was arrested on criminal charges related to the sale and possession of illegal fireworks, and received a Kern County Administrative Citation for fireworks possession, the department reported.

Ernesto Torres, 41, of Bakersfield, also received a Kern County Administrative Citation for fireworks possession, and is pending criminal charges submitted to the District Attorney's Office.

The Kern County Fire Department is handling the disposal of the illegal fireworks.

# First case of West Nile this year found in county

The first case of West Nile in Kern County this year has been identified in southwest Bakersfield.

West Nile is endemic to Kern County, meaning that it is a recurring disease that infests an average of 25 humans in the county every year. Most people infected with the virus will suffer mild symptoms or no symptoms at all.

Up to 20% of those who become infected can experience fever, headache, body aches, joint pain, nausea, vomiting and possible a skin rash. Less than 1% can develop serious life-threatening illnesses

including Encephalitis or Meningitis. Individuals suffering from severe symptoms may experience high fever, neck stiffness, and confusion. Residents who are experiencing any of the above symptoms should contact their medical provider as soon as possible.

Information Officer for the Kern Mosquito and Vector Control District Terry Knight said residents have different ways they can prevent and help deter mosquitoes.

You can decrease your risk of mosquito transmitted disease by avoiding areas where

mosquito numbers may be high, such as at dusk and two hours after. He also advises residents to wear light weight long-sleeved shirts and long pants with socks and shoes. Knight also said that you should apply EPA-registered insect repellents, especially to exposed skin outdoors. Keep all doors and windows closed if possible and make sure that all screens are in good repair to keep mosquitoes out of your home.

Knight also advised residents to maintain swimming pools, preventing water from turning green, and to stock ponds and water troughs with mosquito fish. You can contact Kern Mosquito and Vector Control to obtain them. He also said to remove

standing water from all items around your home, including flower pots, fountains, bird baths, wading pools, pet bowls, gardening tools and toys.

You should also scrub all containers that collect water weekly to remove any remaining eggs with hot water and bleach.

Knight said that in addition to preventing the chance of acquiring the West Nile Virus, these steps will also help in the fight against the newest species of mosquito in Kern County, the so-called ankle biters, the Aedes Aegypti. These mosquitoes are very aggressive. This species does not carry the West Nile Virus, but can become a very bad nuisance.
