

Richland students beginning in-person instruction

Richland students beginning in-person instruction. The Richland School District will be returning to in-person instruction on August 18, a long wait for the students to once again be with their fellow classmates, not separated by computer screens. Richland students will see the same precautions that they grew accustomed to last year, including temperature checks, wearing face coverings while in the classrooms, frequent hand washing. According to Superintendent Rosa Romero, this is a small price to pay for the chance to see their friends again, being able to attend classes in person, as well as being able to catch up with their classmates. "We are excited to have the kids back in school, allowing them to enjoy the full educational experience. We are totally committed to the enrichment of the students and their safety and wellbeing," said Romero. Romero said that they will continue the guidelines put forth by the CDC and the Kern County Department of Health. "We will make sure that we are doing everything possible to make our campus a safe environment. I am glad to see the end of the social distancing, which makes it possible for us to return to in-person instruction." Richland purchased over 3,000 plexiglass barriers, that will be utilized in the classrooms. The students will also be required to wear face coverings while in the classroom. According to Romero, there will remain a large number of hand washing stations in the classrooms and outside of the classrooms. With the report of an outbreak in Wasco, Romero was asked if that gave her any pause in returning to in-person teaching. "Well, we were in the classroom for a good amount of time last year, so we have had a chance to iron out the kinks in the procedures. I think that helps us be more prepared than other schools and districts who have not had the experience of in person sessions under COVID-19 guidelines." Romero said that this does not mean that Richland's pro-

Students excited about returning to school

There was excitement in the air on Monday, August 2, when students returned to school for regular classroom instruction after a year and half of isolation and working on classwork from home. The Wasco Union Elementary School District (WUESD) opened its doors to students for the first time since March 2020, except for special education students and at-risk students, who were able to attend classes at certain times during the pandemic. Every student had the required mask on and offices were crowded with enrolling students and parents.

Thomas Jefferson and Palm Avenue have set up their main office so students from outside walk through the office and leave through a door onto the campus. This was designed for student safety. Due to the hot weather, most students were casually dressed and ready to begin this new journey. The first day of school is always difficult to maneuver around as teachers are rounding up their students, staff is completing last-minute tasks and principals finish up last-minute projects. 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COVID-19 numbers are jumping all over the place

These figures are accumulated from mid-March 2020 when the tracking began. On Aug. 17, Wasco had 5,627 Infected compared to 5,580 on August 10. This is an increase of 47 new cases within the last week. The number of Recovered on August 10 was 2975 while that number in the last week of was 2,981, an increase of 6 newly recovered and the number of Presumed Recovered for Aug. 10 was 2,954 with a decrease to 2,520 in one week's time, a decrease of Presumed Recovered

of 434. The Shafter numbers are also changing. The number of Infected for the week beginning Aug. 17 was 2,304 while that number on Aug. 10 was 3,753, a difference of 1,449 (a large jump in Infected for Shafter.) The number of recovered in Shafter for Aug. 17 was 1,447 while that number for Aug. 10 was 1,434, an increase of 15 Recovered and the number of Presumed Recovered for the week. Aug. 17 was 2,226 while the Aug. 10 number

was 2,654, a decrease of 228 Presumed Recovered for the week. On Aug. 17, a new Public Health Officer order requires hospitals to accept transfer patients from facilities with limited ICU capacity. Kern County Public Health announced a third dose of COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for certain immunocompromised people, such as transplant survivors. "Staying in good health by eating well and regularly exercising are all layers of protection that we encourage our community to use to limit the transmission

of COVID-19," Director of Public Health Services Brynn Carrigan said. "Eat a balanced diet of fruits and veggies and limit sugary beverages. This will help lower your risk for obesity, type 2 diabetes and heart disease - conditions that also make you at higher risk for severe illnesses from COVID-19." Corson also said that there has been a 69.9% increase in first doses of the COVID-19 vaccines administered in Kern County. Vaccination appointments for individuals aged 12+ can be made by visiting myturn.ca.gov.

At the event, families were able to shop for books at the Friends of the Library Book Sale, as well as talk to Bakersfield College representatives about the large number of services that they are offering to the residents of Shafter.

Attendees could also look at the upcoming fall schedule for Bakersfield College, including on-campus classes and after school classes being offered at the Shafter Library and Shafter Learning Center.

An agreement was reached between the City of Shafter and Bakersfield College to reopen the library and having it operated by staff from Bakersfield College. This arrangement means that the Shafter Library is no longer a part of the Kern County Library system. With the Kern County Library Administration electing to keep the Shafter Library closed,

Shafter was in danger of having no library in which the community could utilize. This decision came after the reports that indicated that the Shafter Branch Library had the second highest foot traffic of any of the libraries in the county, as well as one of the highest participation rates in the county.

With the agreement with Bakersfield College, the City of Shafter will pay to have the library open and be staffed by Bakersfield College, with the agreement costing the city about \$300,000 annually.

There were over 100 people that attended the Welcome Back event, enjoying perusing the library for books and learning about the different activities that are planned for the site.

Children who attended were also able to help artist Lorena Castillo paint two large canvases that will hang in the library.


Castillo is the artist that was selected to paint the mural that is located along the brick wall right across from the Shafter Library.

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City creates COVID Prevention Program (CPP)

sure to the Covid-19 virus. This plan shall apply to all employees whether fully

vaccinated or not. They will continue the wearing of masks and employee training regarding possibly having close contact with an infected person. The city will continue with cleaning measures that were implemented during the pandemic and will maintain social distancing.

The city will make changes to the plan as needed.

There were three presentations at the city council meeting. The first one was to thank Deputy Patrick Basquez for his service to the city of Wasco.

Also, Terry Knight, public information officer of the Kern Mosquito & Vector Control District, presented information on a new breed of mosquito that is beginning to invade Kern County. It is called Aedes Aegypti Mosquito.

"These mosquitos are aggressive and come out all day long," he said.

Knight advised if anyone observes standing water anywhere to notify the Vector Control District so they can come out and inspect the area. The following repellants are safe for pregnant and breastfeeding women: Deet, Picaridin, Ole, PMD, 2-Undecanone and IR3535. Safe for children older than 2 months are: Deet, Picaridin, 2-Undecanone and IR3535.

In other business, the city council unanimously approved a new 800-gallon vacuum excavator, which will provide staff with safe digging around utilities. This will minimize injury and damage to underground utilities. The fiscal impact of this purchase is to be paid for by the Water Fund in the amount of \$45,000.

cedures are any better or worse than other districts. "It just means that we have had the opportunity to fine tune our plan."

Breakfast will continue to be served in the classroom. As for lunch, Romero said that lunch periods will be a little more staggered this year, compared to years past. "This will allow us to serve our kids safely and without a really big number of students in the cafeteria at once. "We also have assembled an outdoor dining area as well, giving our students a chance to eat their lunches outside, which can be safer and will also let us serve more children at one time." With numerous high school parents questioning a letter that was sent their homes regarding a bill that would allow school districts go to a Pass/Don't Pass grading system for last year, Romero said that the Richland parents voiced their opinions to keep the letter grade system. "Our parents said that they wanted to keep the letter grading system. They didn't want the Pass/Don't Pass system in their district."

The first day of school is August 18, which will be a welcome sight for parents, students, and teachers alike.

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
Seizing Opportunities

With the new fiscal year, a lot of money and effort is being infused into the Kern County economy to clean up our roads and neighborhoods. In District 4, it's important that we take advantage of these opportunities to make our communities look better, instill pride, and create job opportunities in the rural communities. I guarantee you our office is on the front lines in making this happen. I'd like to share what that means and how you can help.

First, the state has allocated \$1.1 billion statewide toward cleaning up our state highways. How these funds are to be allocated is still being worked out but Caltrans would like to create some satellite locations for work crews in our rural communities to include Arvin/Lamont, Taft, and Delano. The intent is to employ some disadvantaged workers to get them back into the work world cleaning up our freeways and communities. This is a program in which District 4 has led the charge. We already have contracts with the Bakersfield Homeless Center to employ work crews to pick up litter in our district and on the highways but this next phase will be to choose workers from our rural communities to do this work, too.

Along those lines, our office recently met with the Butte County Office of Education, an agency Cal-

trans has contracted with to clean up freeways throughout the state using some disadvantaged workers. They have just opened a job site recently in Delano and we are working closely with them to make sure some of those folks most in need there are connected to these new jobs. This can be a transformative program as too often those most disadvantaged are shut out of the workforce. This jobs skills training program gives them the chance they need to get back on their feet.

In addition, Kern Council of Governments has been a partner in these programs from the beginning, providing funding and guidance, and is looking forward to working with Caltrans and the County to make sure the rural

communities are served.

At the County level, rate increases to combat illegal dumping have just been approved. These programs will be administered by our Public Works Department but the rural communities should be the communities most improved by these new funds as illegal dumping too often happens on our country roads. Whether the funds are distributed to the cities to use or managed by the PW department, this is an opportunity to put people to work and clean up illegal dumping.

Finally, with the recent certification of the Keep Kern Beautiful (KKB) program, our communities are now affiliated with Keep America Beautiful, the national organization that exists to educate and organize communities in their efforts to clean up and beautify their neighborhoods. Through KKB, we can all get involved in making our neighborhoods beautiful. Neighborhood cleanups using volunteers from the community is an empowering way to instill pride and be engaged in making our communities better. And that engagement makes us better too. 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Wasco Union Superintendent says local news station confused message

On Thursday, August 12, Superintendent Kelly Richers of the Wasco Union Elementary School District addressed the public by stating a local news station had confused what he had said while discussing the number of infected students in the district.

"We had to send 10 students home

whose parents contacted the district and advised us their child was sick with the virus," Richers said.

At that time, there was no protocol for dealing with possible virus infections to students who had been in the vicinity of the infected student. Richers also said at that time school had only been in for one week

and the district had not outlined a protocol for this type of situation.

According to Richers, district personnel know where each and every student is at all times and knows who sits next to whom at lunch and during class. Everything is regulated and regimented, Richers stated.

Because the district is aware of the whereabouts of all students at all times, the knowledge of who might have been ex-

posed to the infected student will be immediately aware.

"With this knowledge, the district won't have to send everyone in a classroom home if one student gets infected," Richers added. "We will be able to send home only those who were in an unsafe distance from the infected student."

The district is enjoying good attendance rates and minimally infected students.

certifications from the Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigations in Homicide and Domestic Violence Investigations. She is also a graduate of the Sherman Block Leadership Institute, Class 142.

Over her career she has served a number of various assignments such as a D.A.R.E. officer (Drug Abuse Resistance Education), field training officer (FTO), reserve officer coordinator and trainer and youth council coordinator.

She has worked criminal investigations and presently supervises all field operations. She also oversees all criminal investigations as processed and handled by the detective. Along with these responsibilities, she is also the department field training officer coordinator, 290 (sex registrants) and is the liaison coordinator with the County Street Interdiction Team (SIT). Captain Burnett has also volunteered to represent the department with the Kern County Domestic Violence Law Enforcement Com-

mittee.

Officer Marvin Gomez was promoted to a senior police officer in the department, as well as Senior Police Officer James York. York has been a certified instructor at the firing range for other officers.

During the Public Comment portion of the meeting, a couple of residents voiced concerns about the safety of their families when it comes to the utilization of pesticides around their properties. They want to have a process in place that would require those spraying pesticides in the areas of residential homes, to notify the residents in advance of the plan of the pesticides being sprayed.

After the Public Comment session, Dr. David Franz presented the progress the city has made relating to the transformation of the Shafter Branch Library into the city's own Municipal Library.

An agreement has been proposed between the city of Shafter and Bakersfield College that would have Bakersfield College staff the library. Franz said the city requested a 10-year agreement that would require an annual revisiting the agreement and how the agreement has been performing.

Franz said a couple of big steps have been made in the process, with the Kern

County Board of Supervisors approving the donation of the majority of the existing books that are currently in the library. He also said the Board officially relinquished their interest in the Shafter Library, clearing the way for the city of Shafter to officially terminate its involvement in the Kern County Library system.

Franz said the next steps in the process would be to have the city officially approve the agreement and begin the process of forming their own Municipal Library system. Franz said this process would probably be done by the fall, allowing the library to officially open as a Municipal Library sometime in the fall.

Mayor Prout, Mayor Pro-Tem Givens and Councilmember Pete Espinoza commented on the excitement that can be seen from the parties involved, as well as the community and its amazing support that this has been a long time coming and will be a very positive move for the city and the community.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF KERN-TULARE WATER DISTRICT ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR 2022, FIXING 2022 WATER TOLLS, FIXING AND LEVYING 2022 STANDBY CHARGES, AND LEVYING 2022 SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

WHEREAS, on July 8, 2021 the Board adopted its Resolution 2021-01 which, among other things, declared the Board's intent to (a) adopt the recommended budget for 2022, (b) fix and charge water tolls for water delivered by the District, (c) levy and collect 2022 standby charges upon land in the District's Service Area, (d) levy a special assessment on developed land within the District, and (e) levy a special assessment on the undeveloped land within the District and called a public hearing regarding such matters for August 12, 2021 at which time any person interested could appear and be heard; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 2021-01 was published in the Visalia Times Delta and the Shafter Press and a copy thereof was mailed to each holder of title to land within the District as shown by the District's assessment roll; and

WHEREAS, no person has objected with respect to any matter within Resolution 2021-01; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District and its landowners that the Board now adopt the budget for 2022, fix water tolls for 2022, fix and levy standby charges for 2022, and fix and levy special assessments on developed and undeveloped land within the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of Kern-Tulare Water District as follows:

- 1. Each of the matters set forth above is true and correct and the Board so finds and determines.
2. The Board hereby adopts the District budget for 2022 as shown on the attached Exhibit A.
3. The Board hereby fixes water tolls for 2022 for water delivered by the District at the rates shown on the attached Exhibit B.
4. The Board hereby fixes and levies a standby charge of \$138 per acre upon land in the District's Service Area. The standby charges shall be payable in two equal installments, the first of which shall be delinquent if not paid on or before February 1, 2022, and the second of which shall be delinquent if not paid on or before June 1, 2022. A penalty of 10% shall be added to all standby charges that become delinquent and delinquent standby charges shall bear interest at the rate of 1.5% per month.
5. The Board hereby levies a special assessment of \$27 per acre on developed land within the District and a special assessment of \$20 per acre on the undeveloped land within the District. The special assessments are due September 1, 2021. The special assessment charges shall be payable in two equal installments, the first of which shall be delinquent if not paid on or before February 1, 2022, and the second of which shall be delinquent if not paid on or before June 1, 2022. A penalty of 5% shall be added to all special assessments, or installments thereof, that become delinquent and the District shall immediately begin the tax sale process. Once, the District receives a Certificate of Sale an interest rate of .75% shall be added to the delinquent special assessment for each month, or portion thereof, until the date of redemption or the date upon which the District perfects a Collector's Deed. All property subject to a Certificate of Sale shall be subsequently assessed as though the Certificate of Sale had not been received.
6. The District shall not deliver any water for use on any land as to which any water toll, standby charge or special assessment is delinquent.
7. The Secretary shall transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern.
8. The Assessor shall give notice of the fixing and levying of the standby charges and the special assessments in the manner required by Water Code section 36826.

With California High-Speed Rail

High in the Kern County sky, you can see the progress that continues to be made on the nation's first high-speed rail system.

Garces Highway Viaduct – Structure Complete

- The Garces Highway Viaduct is complete. Recently, crews hauled in more than 11,000 cubic-yards of fill to complete the embankments of the structure.

Peterson Road Bridge – Under Construction

- Crews have already placed 680 cubic-yards of concrete for a portion of the superstructure. Crews are now erecting the stem walls of the structure.

McCombs Road Grade Separation – Under Construction

- Crews continue to install panels and falsework for the posts, stringers and beams for the structure.

Poso Avenue Undercrossing – Under Construction

- Crews recently completed the west side abutments of the undercrossing. Crews will begin to place beams at the end of August.

Wasco Viaduct – Under Construction

- Crews have placed more than 29,000 cubic-yards of concrete to form the deck of the structure. More beams will be placed soon to connect the structure together.

Merced Avenue Grade Separation – Under Construction

- Crews are working on the mechanically-stabilized earth (MSE) walls and hauling dirt for the slopes of the structure.

Kimberlina Road Viaduct – Under Construction

- Abutment walls and falsework for the structure are up at the Kimberlina Road Viaduct.
