Local restaurants are coming alive in varying degrees, with some opening fully and still others taking smaller steps.

In Shafter, the entrance into Phase 2 has meant different things to different people when it comes to the restaurants in town. A few of the restaurants have opened back up, with limitations according to the guidelines set up by Gov. Gavin Newsom and the Kern County Public Health Department.

On one end of the spectrum is China Cuisine, run by Scotty Dang. He said that they opened back up on Thursday, with business being a little slow so far. “I think that some people are still a little nervous about going back into restaurants right now. It will get busier, it will just take a little time.”

Enjoying the reopening was Mike and Kathy Enns. The Ennses and Dennis Atkinson were dining at China Cuisine for the first time in months.

“There is a group of about eight or 10 of us who meet here every Tuesday for dinner. We have really missed it,” said Kathy Enns.

They have still enjoyed the food at China, but it has been take-out only. Dang said that once they got the okay to open back up, they didn’t hesitate, wanting to get back to fully serving the community. Though the restaurant is opened back up, the popular buffet has not been started back up yet.

“We decided we better wait to start up the buffet again, until we feel more comfortable bringing it back. The same thing with the salad bar, we will open that back up soon.”

Dates set for graduations

Veterans honored despite restrictions

With the cancellations of the annual Memorial Day ceremonies that are usually held at cemeteries across the county, Shafter and Wasco still recognized their fallen heroes with American flags on the graves of the veterans who have been laid to rest there.



Robert Martinez and Camilo Vazquez of VFW Post 6742 played host for the event.

Memorial Day honors men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. At the Shafter Memorial Cemetery all of the veterans’ graves were adorned with American flags.

Relatives of those veterans were at the cemetery paying their respects, as well as

putting flowers, decorations, and memorials on the graves, making it a day of reflection and remembrance.

At the Wasco Memorial Cemetery, VFW Post 6742 paid tribute to the veterans buried there.

In addition to the flags, the VFW set up a display that included a wooden cut-out of a soldier aiming his rifle, and a couple of signs that displayed the quote, “All Gave Some, and Some Gave All.” This popular quote has been attributed to William Osterkamp, who served in the Army during the Korean War. Osterkamp was wounded in the leg by shrapnel while fighting near the 38th parallel. Upon being injured, Osterkamp was taken to Army doctors who misdiagnosed his injury. He was sent back to the front lines with his leg broken in two places and stayed there for four months.

The saying points to the soldiers across the nation, all of whom gave some of their selves, while others ultimately gave all.

Man dies in stabbing

A man is dead after a stabbing on F Street Wednesday.

Detectives were investigating the scene Wednesday after a report of a possible homicide.

When deputies arrived, they located a deceased adult male, with multiple stab wounds.

During the investigation, detectives learned 28-year-old Juan Carlos Ortega was the suspect in the investigation. A warrant for his ar-

rest, charging him with murder, was obtained.

Ortega was described as a Hispanic male, 6 feet tall and 160 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. He was believed to be driving a light-colored 4-door Honda sedan with a dark-colored passenger side door and hood, license 5PRT838.

There was a ribbon cutting at the Shafter Farm Labor Camp. They built 84 new housing units at the camp, 17213 Central Valley Hwy.

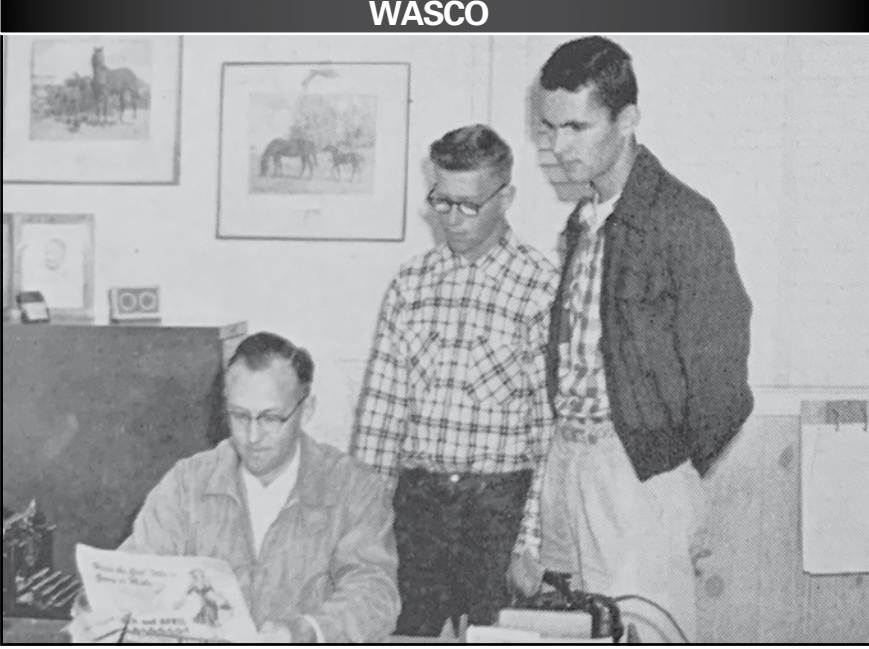
30 years ago: May 30, 1990

Also receiving a Presidential Award was Addison Garcia. Addison plans on going to Shafter High, then to college in pursuit of becoming a teacher. She held a GPA of over 3.78 in her years at Maple. Her favor-

ite memories at Maple were Camp Keep, the trip to Washington, D.C., and the annual BBQ and Carnival.

This class of eighth-graders has been through a series of challenges, with the current COVID-19 pandemic affecting their graduation, as well as going to class the past two years with the construction and renovation of the school going on. The students had to use portable classrooms, go without administration buildings for a time, and had to weather more than one storm as the workers were trying hard to get the school completed on time.

Boesch said it was important to recognize these students. "They have worked so hard for the past eight years, preparing themselves for high school," she said. "We needed to do something for these kids and this graduation was just great."

Of the 31 kids, many will be attending Shafter High in the fall, with the remainder going to Wasco.

On the other end of the spectrum is La Fonda Restaurant. The restaurant enjoyed a brisk take-out business during the pandemic, and still has its booths and tables taped off. "We might open back up on June 1 or maybe on the 15th," Maria said. "We have not received a letter or anything saying that we can open back up, so we are waiting."

All of the fast-food places in town are open for business, for dine-in and take out. Once Kern County's Phase I of the recent COVID-19 pandemic began to lift, restaurants hesitantly began to open their doors to customers to begin providing dine-in service. Customers and business owners began to breathe a sigh of relief as soon as businesses in the state began to open.

The opening of restaurants and shopping malls began May 24, in time for the Memorial Day holiday weekend. Restaurants and shopping malls must meet state standards for testing and show that the number of cases of the virus are not increasing, and all businesses will have to abide by state guidelines for physical distancing and cleaning regiments.

Two months after the governor issued a stay-at-home order that closed most businesses, Newsom said that restaurants could reopen for dine-in service in counties certified as meeting state rules and regulations for addressing the pandemic, but they should make changes to make sure the virus doesn't spread.

Before a business reopens, a county must complete a risk assessment and develop protection plans that include training employees how to limit the

spread of the virus and:

- Screen employees.
- Initiate disinfectant rules and regulations.
- Maintain physical distancing guidelines.
- Draft a plan to protect customers, including a method of screening employees to determine if they are sick.

Counties must have adequate testing and hospital rooms with the ability to trace those who have been in contact with ill people.

In Wasco, one of the restaurants that was able to maintain solvency was Hoyett's Sandwich Shop on 6th Street. Hoyett's announced on Facebook Tuesday that they are doing some sprucing up inside and for the rest of this week, they would be taking drive-up and call-in orders only. Hoyett's announced they will be ready for dine-in June 1.

"We will be taping off booths that customers cannot sit in," Lydia Adams said. "Everyone working will wear their mask. We may have one stool open at the counter, but the rest will be removed."

During the quarantine, Hoyett's offered heir catfish and tri-tip dinner plates on

the weekend; in addition, with many of their regular plates discounted.

Another popular restaurant in Wasco is Catrina's Mexican Grill and Cantina, on F Street. Catrina's offered take-out specials during the week and provided curbside service. It was closed Wednesday morning, with no sign of when they would be open.

Teresa's Mexican Restaurant served customers with their drive-up and call-in orders. The parking lot usually had one or two cars in the parking lot during the quarantine. Now that Wasco is headed for a Phase 2 opening, customers are now welcome to dine in under the guidelines.

Upon entering Teresa's, one customer was eating breakfast by himself in the back of the restaurant, and two customers walked in and sat at a table at the opposite end of the restaurant.

"All employees will wear masks," Manager Sherrie Aguilera said. "We've been disinfecting more, using pre-wrapped plastic utensils and paper cups, but we are using regular plates."

None of the customers

in Teresa's were wearing masks.

Mike McCurdy was enjoying his breakfast by himself midmorning. He laughed when I asked for a picture and said, "Now my wife will know where I am."

Also dining at Teresa's at the opposite end of the restaurant were Stormy Byrd and Bob Peters.

While discussing the recent quarantine, Peters expressed his frustration. "We didn't close the country down for the war," he said.

"This was a political move," Byrd said. "The president was against closing down the country, but the opposition wanted the country quarantined and shut down causing so much trouble in businesses."

Both agreed that it was good to be able to dine out again.

Cars were lined up outside waiting for drive-up service.

"Because of how our dining area is set up with the big table in the middle of the room, we won't be allowing dining inside for a while," employee Danny Dominguez said. "Customers can come in and order and leave right away."

5% hike seen in fire, police

The city would see a 5% increase in the cost of its contracts with the Kern County Sheriff's Department, City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez told the City Council Tuesday night.

"This amounts to an additional \$199,000 to \$200,000" per year, Ortiz-Hernandez told the virtual meeting.

Nevertheless, "it would be cost-prohibitive for the city to have its own police force," Mayor Tilo Cortez said.

While the budget workshop was available online through Zoom, some attendees were unable to use the link provided in the board packet and had to resort to listening without being able to see what was being presented on the screen.

One of the projects discussed by the council was to convert the original farm labor housing to an animal shelter. "Building a new animal shelter could cost the city \$1.2 million," Ortiz-Hernandez said. "The renovation of the current farm labor housing complex could cost half that, \$680,000."

Ortiz-Hernandez said the city can expect to see a reduction in revenue, as residents are shopping less. He said the city's revenue is based on sales tax, use tax and fees charged for city services.

"Revenues have decreased due to the COVID-19 pandemic," Ortiz-Hernandez said.

"Property tax revenues have re-

mained stationary," Cortez said in a followup conversation Wednesday morning. "We haven't seen a major increase in property taxes. It's remained flat."

The council went line item by line item while reviewing the proposed budget.

They approved applying for another three-year COPS grant, which would enable the city to hire more deputies. "The grant would pay for the first \$125,000 for a new officer," Cortez said. "The city would have to come up with an additional \$40,000, and those funds would come out of Measure X funds."

The City Council decided to continue their budget workshop on Wednesday, June 3, at 5 p.m. – again, virtually.

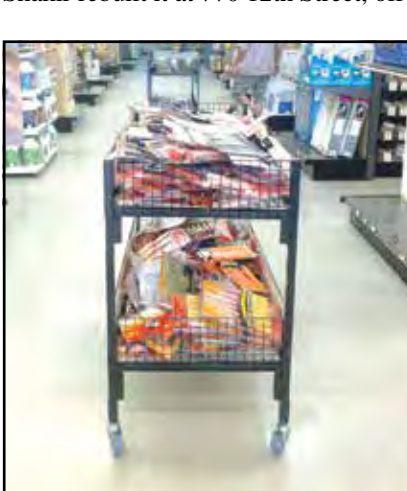
True Value adds store on Highway 46

"They can learn electrical, plumbing, hardware, concrete and gardening. This would help younger employees have a better opportunity for other positions in these fields."

The new True Value carries the same merchandise but is more open with ceiling fans placed throughout. Fernandez said that the new True Value carries the same merchandise as the smaller one on 12th Street, but the new store carries more merchandise and is brighter inside.

"We carry all types of tools, lumber, hardware and plumbing items such as toilets, flappers, light switches, drills, etc. -- just about anything a contractor might need," Fernandez said.

About a year ago, Fernandez said that the owner met with an architectural firm about expanding the business another 500 square feet. Instead, they expanded by 10,000 by purchasing a portion of the Kmart store.
