## Motion to raise Pride flag at City Hall fails

The City Council spent over an hour on a presentation on raising a Pride flag in front of City Hall during the month of June each year, which is known as Pride Month, during its meeting Tuesday. The motion ultimately failed 3-1.

Over 20 people addressed the council

about their feelings on this issue.

The majority of the speakers were against the raising of a flag commemorating Pride Month and several questioned “Where will it stop?”

Mayor Alex Garcia presented arguments in favor of raising the flag for the popula-

tion that feels unrepresented and expressed it would give that particular group of residents a feeling of belonging and acceptance. A couple of speakers from Delano addressed the issue and were in favor of raising the flag. Wasco would be the first city in the area to do so.

“I am in support of Garcia,” Mayor of Delano Brian Osorio said. “It shows soli-

arity to a community that needs support.”

Those who spoke against the raising of the Pride flag felt that it gave the wrong message to other communities. Garcia was also accused of placing the item on the agenda, which several felt was self-serving.

“If Alex had come out as gay before the election, the results might have been differ-

The Shafter High graduating class of 2021 took their last walk across the stage as a student, beginning their lives of Shafter High alumni on Wednesday night on the Shafter High campus.

The commencement began with a welcome by Principal Russell Shipley, who told the attendees, “I am so proud to have this class graduating on the Shafter High campus, after the momentous challenges they have faced in the past couple of years.”

This year’s graduating class was one of the biggest in history, with a total of 370 students receiving their diplomas.

One of the speakers was ASB President Nick Aguirre, who spoke about the experiences they have had in the past year.

“We lost a lot in our high school careers this past year, like our Shafter vs. Wasco rivalry game, school dances, and just seeing our friends in the halls,” Aguirre said. “We can be proud of the way that we handled the challenges and obstacles put in front of us.”

## New police officers announced

The City Council was introduced to three new officers who have joined the Shafter Police Department.

Officer Marvin Gomez, who is a Kern County Sheriff’s Office veteran of over 25 years, was hired by the department in May 2021 and is his second phase of field training. Chief Kevin Zimmermann said that the city is fortunate to have hired Gomez, who is a county leader in the Gang Task Force Units and has been one of the foremost experts in fighting gang activity.

Officer Rachel Carrasco was hired this month and is in her first phase of field training. Carrasco comes to Shafter from the Kern County Sheriff’s Office, where she has served as a deputy for the past 10 years. Carrasco has experience as a detentions officer, academy teacher, and in the drug task force.

Officer Matthew Sanchez comes from a law enforcement family and his father worked for the Kern County Sheriff’s Office for decades before moving to his current position working for the Department of Motor Vehicles. Sanchez has been in law enforcement since 1999 and most recently served as a patrol officer for San Luis Obispo.

The council voiced their excitement for these experienced officers to join the Shafter department.

“We want the best and we thank you, Chief, for getting us the best,” said City Council member Gilbert Alvarado.

## Man arrested for vandalism at Green Hotel

A man has been charged by the Shafter Police Department after the fourth incident of vandalism at the Green Hotel in the last 10 months.

Adolfo Morenocallejas was arrested Friday after being found by police exiting the hotel. Former Shafter mayor and former City Council member Garry Nelson had went to the Green Hotel around 11:30 a.m. on Thursday morning, wanting to check up on the property. When he arrived, he noticed that the back window had been bro-

ken. Nelson entered and also found the remains of the thermostat on the floor. Police believe the suspect thought the thermostat was the alarm and smashed it. The suspect then broke the alarm, police said.

When Nelson was walking to the front of the hotel, he noticed a man walking to the front door. At approximately the same time, two officers from the Shafter Police Department were arriving because they got a report that the alarm was not working. Upon arrival, the man,

later identified as Morenocallejas, was heading out the front door until he was detained by the officers after Nelson said he did not know the man.

After further investigation, it was determined that the suspect had been sleeping at the hotel, with one of the beds upstairs looking like someone had been sleeping in it.

This is the first time in the last 10 months since there were issues with vandalism that someone was charged in the crime.

Officers booked Morenocallejas into the Kern County Jail.

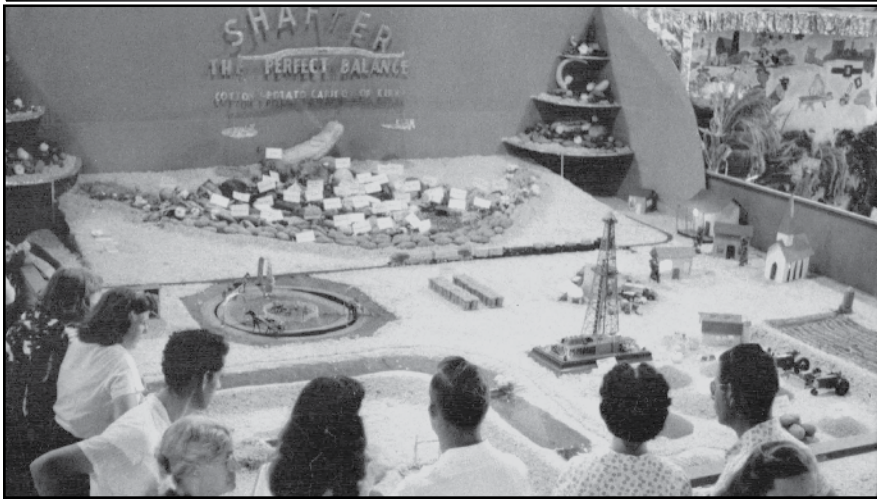

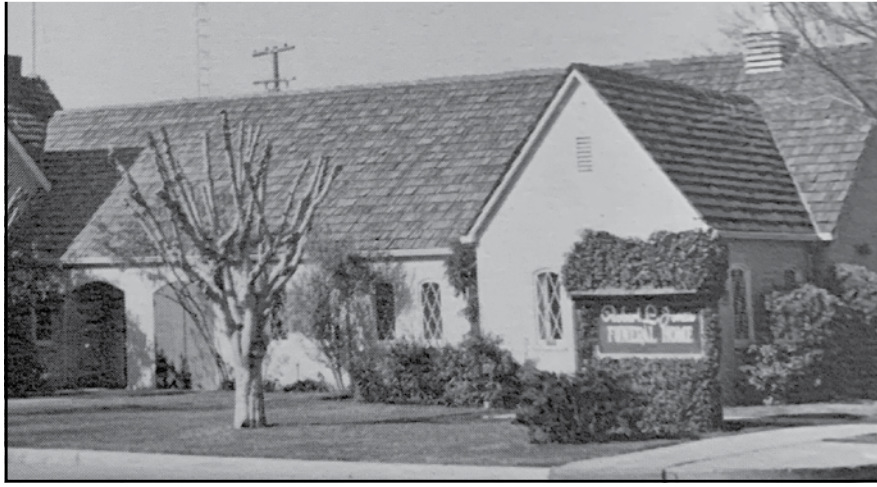

# Elementary school district will begin classes Aug. 2

School will begin Monday, Aug. 2 for the Wasco Union Elementary School District, Superintendent Kelly Richers clarified after he said a letter with an incorrect date went out to parents.

Teachers will return July 27 for voluntary professional development and July 28 for mandatory professional development, Richers said at the district board meeting.

The board also unanimously adopted the 2021-22 budget along with the LCFF Simplified Local Control Funding Formula. These are California school funding laws.

Richers said at the last board meeting that the district's budget looks good

for the next two years; however the third year will be a difficult one regarding funding.

Richers also said a special board meeting may be called June 30 to finalize and adopt the California School Employees Association proposal.

# Chamber hosts free vaccine clinic

The Shafter Chamber of Commerce held a free covid-19 vaccine clinic at the Shafter Veterans Hall on Saturday, June 12,

helping residents get vaccinated as the state begins to reopen.

The event was sponsored by the chamber, as well as Dignity Health, Kern County Public Health, the United Way of Kern, CAPK Food Bank and Adventist Health. Residents could receive the one-shot Johnson & Johnson vaccine or the two-shot Moderna vaccine.

Both vaccines have shown a high percentage of effectiveness, with Johnson & Johnson at over 70% and Moderna over 90%.



The event was sponsored by the City of Shafter, Kaiser Permanente, Adventist Health, Dignity Health, Kern County Public Health, Shafter Chamber of Commerce, the United Way of Kern and CAPK Food Bank.

Over 100 people attended the event, with a number of those receiving their second vaccine, after getting their initial shot at a previous clinic.

Gov. Gavin Newsom opened the state on June 15, allowing residents to shop or gather in large groups without a face cover-

ing if they are vaccinated.

"I am really thankful for not having to wear a mask anymore," said Shafter resident Maria Rodriguez. "But, I just hope that enough people have got vaccinated by now that the cases won't start going up again."

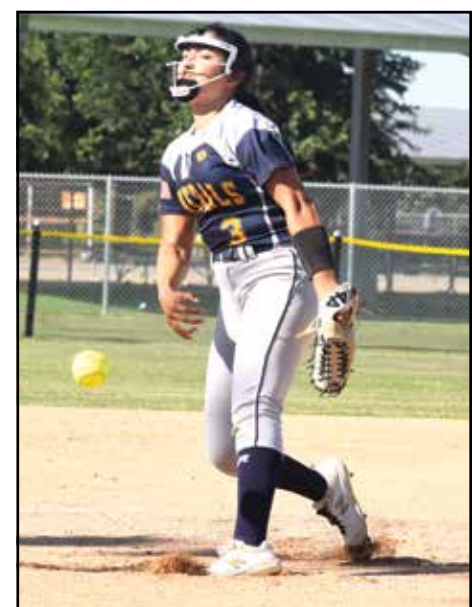
inning.

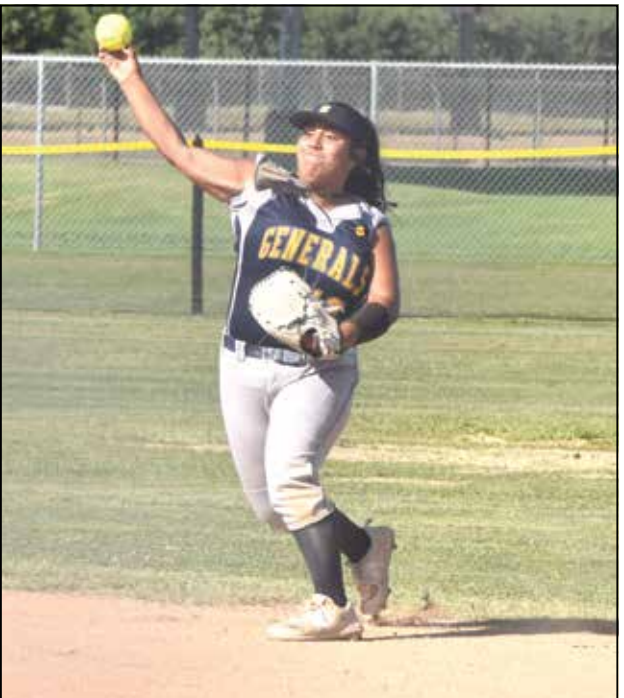
The Lady Generals played a very clean game defensively. The Lady Generals are led by head coaches Julie Garcia and Sharaya Durant.

# State reopens, some restrictions remain

The state officially opened up June 15, but there are still some restrictions especially if you are unvaccinated. Gov. Gavin Newsom retired the Covid-19 Blueprint on Tuesday. "Everyday life should feel a lot like it

did before with most places being open and returning to usual operation with no capacity limitations or social distancing requirements," Michelle Corson public information officer for the Kern County Health Department said. "The only exception to this is for 'mega events,' defined as an indoor event with more than 5,000 people, which requires verified fully vaccinated status or pre-entry negative covid-19 test and required masking for those who are unvaccinated."

Corson added that these requirements will be in place at least until Oct. 1 while the state continues to monitor vaccination and infection rates.

She said fully vaccinated people will be allowed to do almost everything they did pre-pandemic without wearing a mask including grocery shopping, drinking at a bar and going to the gym.

"If you're not vaccinated, the state's masking guidance still requires you to wear a mask in 'indoor public settings,'" Corson added. "That includes grocery stores, shops, restaurants, movie theaters and other indoor businesses."

She also noted that masks are still required in the following places:

Any form of public transportation regardless of vaccination status,

Hospitals and long-term care facilities, regardless of vaccination status,

Indoors at K-12 schools and childcare facilities. People, including teachers and students, who are vaccinated are still going to need to wear masks when they are indoors; however, they don't have to wear masks while outdoors, like on a playground,

Prisons and homeless shelters, regardless of vaccination status, and Indoor workplaces, regardless of vaccination status.

Unvaccinated Californians will still have to wear masks at all indoor public settings, like stores, restaurants, salons, etc.

There will private businesses that will still require masks upon entrance.

On Tuesday, June 15, the number of infected in Wasco was 5,451 compared to 5,425 the week of June 3. The number of recovered for June 15 was 2,537 compared to June 3 recovered of 2,394 and the number of presumed recovered for June 15 was 2,813 compared to 2,921 on June 3.

The number for Shafter infected for June 15 was 3,600 compared to 3,586 for June 3. The number of recovered for June 15 in Shafter was 1,405 compared to 1,394 the week of June 3 and the number of presumed recovered for June 15 in Shafter was 2,104 compared to 2,087 on June 3.

ent,” Marcela Escobedo stated. She stated that Garcia didn’t become outspoken until after he was elected and chosen as mayor.  
Yolanda Harrison said, “When you raise the flag to certain groups of people, you are excluding other groups.”  
Julian Sanchez Ochoa also said that he was opposed to raising the flag in front of City Hall. He asked members of the council to remember they are voting for the people of Wasco.  
“This will divide the city and people will move out of the city,” Ochoa said. “We

should be looking into the real issues such as horrible gang violence. Your priorities need to be right.”  
Council member Vince Martinez stated this was not a political issue but a symbolic issue.  
“The city has provided proclamations to other groups and that has worked well in the past,” Martinez said. “It will distract from important issues within the city.”  
However, Garcia replied that raising the Pride Flag is not just symbolic.  
The motion failed 3-1.  
**Kern County Sheriff’s Office agreement renewed**

The City of Wasco unanimously approved an agreement between the city and the County of Kern to provide law enforcement services within the city.  
Several changes were made to the contract. The base cost for the contract represents an increase of 8.96% or \$352.79 over the prior year’s base contract cost. The cost for fiscal year 2021-22 will be \$4,290,052 compared to \$3,937,263 for the current year that ends June 30.  
Overtime has been increased from 9% of deputies’ salaries to a new rate of 15%.  
Under the new agreement, KCSO will not replace a deputy; however, the KCSO

will cover the deputy’s shift if possible with existing resources at the Wasco substation through schedule adjustments. The minimum requirement of two deputies on duty at any given time remains the same.  
SWAT, detectives and bomb squad callouts were previously sent out at no additional costs, but under the new agreement, the city will bear the cost of these units when used.  
City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez said this was his last City Council meeting prior to his leaving. Council members all wished him well and complimented him on his commitment to the city.

In other council action, there was a presentation introducing Shafter's Urban Water Management Plan for the community. The plan reported that there has been a growth in the water customers numbers, specifically in the Gossamer Grove area, but this area is serviced by the Oil-dale Mutual Water Company, not the City of Shafter. The City of Shafter currently has a total of nine water wells, with six of those currently serving the city's water

needs. The report said that the city's water conservation steps have improved the water supply and have strengthened the city's position when it comes to its water needs. The report concluded that the city's water supply capacities are sufficient to serve the city through the year 2045, as well as the possibility of instituting a recycled water system that could be implemented if the need arises. This would include a 7.5 mile pipeline that would take waste water

to the treatment plant and then have that water cleaned and recycled for agricultural use. The City Council also voted to approve their annual Operating Budget for the fiscal year 2021-22, with a balanced budget that is showing a more positive result than what was projected this last year. According to City Manager Gabriel Gonzalez, the projected \$4 million loss in sales tax revenue did not materialize, in a large part due to the online tax revenue that

the city enjoyed this past year. City expenditures include the department budgets, including the Police Department, which has a budget of \$7.5 million, compared to last year's \$6.7 million. "With the projected losses from last year not realized, the city has an even stronger stance this year and instead of hoping to just stay the ship, trying to keep an even keel, we are in recovery mode and are in a strong position for this fiscal year," said Gonzalez.
