Max Hanner, a pilot who died during a crash Nov. 3, was recently remembered at a memorial service at Minter Field.

Max Hanner was a long-time pilot for Inland Cropdusters, Inc., flying for them for over 30 years.

Hanner was tragically killed on Nov. 3, near the Minter Field Airport, in a field across from The Grapery. Hanner lost control of the aircraft and crashed, bursting into flames upon impact.

While Hanner flew as an occupation, it was also his passion.

When he was in the air, he was at peace, soaring in the clouds. Hanner became interested in flying when was





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# Public Health: Closely monitoring for variant

The number of people who have covid-19 continues to rise in Shafter and Wasco. On Nov. 23, the total number of infected in Shafter since March 2020 increased from 4,570 to 4,731, an increase of 161 newly in-

fectured. The number of infected continues to rise in Wasco from Nov. 23 of 6,748 cases to an increase of 93 on Nov. 30 of 6,841 cases. Michelle Corson, of Kern County Public Health, provided information on the new

Omicron variant of the covid-19 virus. Corson said the California Department of Public Health is closely monitoring the new variant, which has not arrived in California or the United States. She added that vaccines continue to be the best way through the pandemic by safely protecting everyone against severe illness.

Corson also said travelers who have been in South Africa, Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia or Zimbabwe within the last 14 days must follow CDC recommendations to get tested 3-5 days after arrival, quarantine for 7 days, even if the test is negative and isolate for 10 days if symptoms develop.


# Football coach honored as Coach of the Year

Wasco High School Varsity Football Coach Chad Martinez was awarded KGET News' FFX inaugural "Coach of the Year."



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# Court ruling clears way for indoor church services

The state ruled Dec. 10 that excluding churches from holding indoor services goes against Freedom of Religion.

California Superior Court Judge Gregory Pulskamp issued an injunction against Gov. Gavin Newsom's planned covid-19 restrictions, following a similar injunction was placed in New York, in favor of a Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn on behalf of Father Trevor Burfitt.

The ruling stated that the governor's restrictions failed to treat houses of worship in a manner equal to the favored class of entities which would include big-box retail stores, grocery stores, hotels, train and bus stations, and other entities that are considered essential businesses.

According to the State of California Superior Court, they state that the members of the court are not health experts and should respect the judgment of those with special expertise and responsibilities in this area.

"Even in a pandemic, the Constitution cannot be put away and forgotten," the statement reads.

The court said people continue to have the freedom to walk the aisles of Walmart

or other stores, while not being able to attend church services and are required to do so virtually or outdoors.

With the changing weather and the temperature dropping, it was clear that the current weather will not be conducive to an outdoor religious service.

New Generation has online services on Sundays at 11 a.m., streaming on NGWasco YouTube and livestreaming on Facebook. They are also on Wednesdays at 7 p.m.

*Some churches stated that they will be holding services indoors and will be continuing their livestreaming as well for those parishioners who wish to worship virtually.*

### St. John's Catholic Church

St. John's Catholic Church, on 9th Place, is offering a Facebook Christmas Eve Mass at 7 p.m. The church has been holding virtual services every Sunday. The church does not offer Saturday Masses at this time;

however their Sunday Mass is 10 a.m. in English and noon in Spanish.

The church is also hosting a Christmas Day Mass in English at 10 a.m. and at

noon in Spanish.

Pastor Fernando Segura, of Canyon Hills Wasco, said that they are not having a Christmas Eve or Christmas Day service because they are maintaining a low profile during the pandemic.

It is a different story in Shafter as the majority of the churches have been holding indoor services for a few weeks now. Those churches stated that they will be holding services indoors and will be continuing their livestreaming as well for those parish-

ioners who wish to worship virtually.

### St. Therese's Catholic Church

St. Therese's Catholic Church, in Shafter, will be holding indoor services for the holidays for those people who want to attend in person.

### Shafter Mennonite Brethren Church

Pastor Pat Coyle, of Shafter Mennonite Brethren Church, said that they have been holding services indoors for several weeks.

"We did hold services virtually and outdoors for a time, but as the weather got colder, we felt it necessary to move the services indoors," said Coyle. With the recent ruling in favor of the churches by the State Superior Court, Coyle said that it does allow him to rest a little easier.

"We didn't enjoy being rule breakers, as it were, but this ruling does make the move easier," he said.

That was a sentiment shared by a lot of churchgoers in Shafter.

"I have been attending church for a few weeks now in person," said Marjorie Bertrand. "I can go shopping for food, get gas, shop for clothes, why can't I go to church and worship indoors? I thought that it was silly to make us go to church outdoors in the first place."

Vaccine requirements for staff, effective Oct. 15, all “school workers,” including all school employees, substitutes, coaches, tutors or others that work in proximity to students must either Document they have received the covid-19 vaccine or produce a negative covid-19 test on a weekly basis.

Cobb added that these are the current vaccine requirements for all staff and school workers and they could change in the future as Gov. Gavin Newsom has indicated that the weekly testing option may expire once students are required to receive the vaccine.

He said currently, about 75% of the staff is vaccinated and the district continues to encourage all staff to consider receiving the vaccine if they can as it is the best way to reduce the risk associated with severe illness or death. Cobb said as soon as the FDA provides full approval — which is expected in early 2022 — all students in Grades 7-12 will be required to receive the covid-19 vaccine by the following school term.

“For example, if the FDA provides full approval in January 2022 (as expected), the student vaccine would be required for the 2022-2023 school year for all students enrolled in pub-

lic and private schools for “in-person” learning,” Cobb said.

Exceptions to this requirement can be made based on documented medical reasons, firmly-held religious beliefs or personal beliefs.

Students who don’t exercise one of the exceptions above may continue to participate in the Independent Study Program with remote / virtual teacher interaction.

“While we understand that these requirements may be supported by some parents and are opposed by others, it

is important to understand that school districts are simply following the legal requirements created by law or government order,” Cobb added. “The Wasco Union High School District has not initiated any vaccine requirements other than what is required by law in California and has no authority to reject the vaccine requirement imposed by the California Department of Public Health.”

# Students learn all about agriculture in edible schoolyard

helping prepare the food for their lunches. "Our children don't just go out and pick a few vegetables, or maybe water the crops, they are involved in every part of the pro-

cess," said Webb.

The garden contains vegetables such as beets, carrots, cabbage, onions, fennel, and many more varieties. They also grow their own herbs such as rosemary, thyme, sage and cilantro.

The students participate in the program, which goes in five-week rotations, and includes every grade level. Each part of the process is done by the students, giving them duties that are age appropriate.

"The kindergartners might help water the crops and weed, while the first graders pick the vegetables, with the upper grades learning how to slice the produce,

and prepare the vegetables, such as sauteing some onions, or peppers," Webb said.

"Another great part of the program is the involvement of the parents and the entire family. We have nights in which a recipe is given out and each family is given the produce necessary for that recipe, then each family prepares that recipe, with the vegetables that their own children had a part in producing," Webb said. "It is great to see the kids' faces as they look at the finished product of their hard work, allowing them to see what they can create and how they can be a part of the agricultural process."

In addition to giving them firsthand experience on how to bring produce to the table, the program also teaches the students how food actually shows up on their tables.

They learn the process, from preparing the soil, tending to the crop while it

is growing, to harvesting the produce and preparing it.

"In Shafter, and the surrounding communities, agriculture is a big part of the economy," Webb said. "It is great to be a part of something like this, that makes the kids realize what a big part of the success of our communities is owed to those who work to feed the community."

protecting his community. In Albert's spare time, his two favorite places to be were out on the lake or at home working on his Harley Davidson.


