Report: City 'financially sound'

Sales taxes help build assets

Unexpected sales tax revenue from online business, higher oil prices and new businesses have put the city in an improved financial position, according to reviews presented to the City Council this week.

The Shafter City Council listened to a presentation of the Financial Report and Audit for the fiscal year ending June 30 at their regular meeting on Tuesday.

Presented by acting City Manager Jim Zervis, the report stated that the city is "financially sound" and had a net increase of total assets of over \$12 million. Ken Pun, of The Pun Group, Inc., who did an audit on the financial reports prepared by Zervis and his staff.

The city ended the fiscal year with over \$168 million in its asset portfolio, up from \$156 million in 2018. The majority of this increase was sales tax revenue, about \$2 million over what was projected in the budget due to an improvement in sales tax revenue from a large online retailer within the city, recovering crude oil prices and the development of new businesses within the city.

The majority of the \$12 million change in the city's financial position is the result of an increase in governmental revenues, which are items such as sales tax, property tax, charges for service, such as fees associated with running the Modified Community Correctional Facility. The revenue accounted for by the MCCF was one of the few items that decreased from 2018, because of the total average inmate population for the year.

There was a \$700,000 deficit in the Rail Spur Services. See CITY Page 5

High Speed Rail passes environmental test

The California High Speed Rail Authority has recently completed the Environmental Clearance for the final 23-mile route between Shafter and Bakersfield. This clearance completes the state's environmental review process between Fresno and Bakersfield and allows the authority to move forward with project construction

into Bakersfield.

This is the first major environmental action taken under the newly granted federal National Environmental Policy Act, and emphasizes the authority's commitment to accelerate the project under the new executive leadership.

Questions were arising under the old leadership about the commitment that the Authority had about completing the project,

with delays impeding the progress of the project for the past two years.

High Speed Rail Authority CEO Brian Kelly said that he is looking forward to the next phase of the project. "I am proud of the combined efforts that went into the process and we are prepared to move forward on the project implementation into Bakersfield, together with our local partners and this collaborative effort."

The process has not been a swift or easy one. In the process of finalizing the environmental document that clears the way for the next phase of the project, the authority held over 100 stakeholder meetings and numerous public workshops, as well as 15 monthly regulatory agency coordination meetings.

The new document evaluates potential See HIGH Page 5





opened with a very steady ground game, outlasting her opponent Amy Swall in most of the points and winning the first set. Swall came back in the second set, forcing Galindo into some errors. After a lot of rallies lasting more than a minute each, Swall pulled out the second set in a tiebreaker, forcing a third set. Galindo pushed Swall to the limit before succumbing 8-10 in the third set tiebreaker.

The other singles matches were equally competitive, but the Lady Generals came up just short, leaving them with an insurmountable deficit. The Lady Generals won the doubles matches, making the final score 5-4.

At one point in the singles portion, Shafter had the lead in four of the remaining matches. But, the Mission Oak players were ultimately able to pull ahead. The Hawks' experience made the difference in the majority of matches. Early on in the

match, Shafter Coach Lana Sharp said, "Mission Oak has a team full of seniors who have played together for four years. We have zero seniors, and our players have played together for three years. This might end up hurting us."

Coach Sharp, who has coached the Lady Generals for eight years, does so as a volunteer. She has imbedded in the team a solid foundation of the fundamentals, teaching the girls how to play the game correctly and enabling them to compete at a high level.

"The girls competed really well. The rallies were anywhere from 20 to 30 shots. It was a point here and a point there that decided the outcome of certain matches," said Sharp. "The way our girls competed was very respectable. I am really proud of them."

With the entire starting lineup returning for the Lady Generals, the team is expected to be a top contender for the Valley title.

The business sells a variety of phones – some unlocked – which means they can take a SIM card or be set up to any provider. Ceballos said prepaid services are more popular than ever. "People sometimes don't want that contract hanging over their head. They can just pay a flat rate for service and not be in a long-term commitment."

The store also does repairs to broken screens, fixes battery issues and offers a wide

variety of accessories, including cases, chargers, ear buds, headphones, speakers and travel kits. "People need to stay connected no matter where they go now, which means they need travel chargers, battery packs, anything that will keep them powered up on the go."

Ceballos said iPhones are probably his biggest sellers, although they also sell a lot of Samsung phones.

A unique service the store provides is the ability to pay phone bills in a different

country. They can do transactions to pay bills in Mexico, Honduras, Guatemala and other countries. "We also do money transfers to Central America, South America and a lot of transfers to Mexico."

Shafter has been home to Ceballos

and his family since 2004, and he says he couldn't ask for a better city to live in. "We came from the San Fernando Valley, and it was just chaos. Shafter is so peaceful and friendly. It is such a great place to raise your kids and call home."

Teaching students a trade: Woodshop

'Build something and be proud of it'

Shafter High School strives to teach students not just academics but skills they can take into the world. Many of the courses on campus focus on vocational skills that teach students a trade that can lead them to a career after high school. Shafter High is one of five schools in the high school

hired in the fall of 2017 and brought a fresh perspective to the program. The program consists of three courses that build on each other: Industrial Arts, Wood 1, and Wood 2. Industrial Arts is the introductory course that teaches students drafting, woodworking and cold metals.

The course focuses on basic use of measurements, drawings and equipment. The students have the opportunity to make small projects, such as a picture frame, jewelry box, dust pan, tool box and an outdoor water hose holder.

Wood 1 builds upon the skills learned from Industrial Arts to work on bigger projects in cabinetry, such as a nightstand.

The goal of Wood 1 is to give students multiple opportunities to learn and relearn construction methods throughout the course so they can succeed in the final project. Finally, Wood 2 continues to build on the skills learned in the program to work on even bigger projects. Students complete a bookcase,

adirondack chair and entertainment center during this capstone course.

The past four years, Shafter High School has partnered with Bakersfield College to offer students in the woodshop program college credit for the course-work they do in the high

school district that proudly offers woodshop as a vocational Career Technical Education class.

The last few years, Shafter High School has revamped the Woodshop program to better serve students. Justin Verrell, the woodshop teacher, was

school classroom. The students do the same projects at Shafter as they do at BC. This opportunity allows students to not repeat courses at the collegiate level, enter college with credits making them ahead of graduation pace, and ultimately save money.

Justin Verrell got into teaching woodshop by watching his father teach the same subject for over 30 years in the high school district. His "biggest goal for this class is not to have 30 kids enter carpentry. [He] want[s] 30 kids to build something and be proud of it." Justin believes that being proud of something "develops a character that few students have. This character can be taken into their life moving forward." Justin is excited for the growth of the program and looks forward to seeing what his students can achieve each year.

Supporting academic success

Shafter High School has implemented a new Academic Supports program on campus. The high school recognizes that academics do not come naturally to every student and may need extra support to be successful in the classroom.

The program is designed for freshman and sophomore students who have been observed as students who may need extra academic support. The students are placed in a specific class that teachers them organizational skills, communication skills with teachers and peers, and skills on how to address assignments that may seem too difficult.

Lyndsy Weikel, the teacher of this course, is very passionate about helping these students. She knows that every student has the ability to be successful in the classroom but may lack the skills to be successful.

She designs her weeks for students' success with a specific focus on each day. The course work spends time teaching students about growth mindset, how to persevere through failures, and how to monitor their behavior and academics in and out of the classroom.

Often these are the stu-

dents that fall through the cracks as they reach high school. But it is the mis-

sion of SHS to ensure that all students learn the skills necessary to achieve suc-

cess. Although the class keeps Mrs. Weikel on her toes, she says "the reward of seeing these students improve daily is worth it."

As the first quarter of the school year comes to a close, there are many celebrations coming from these students; such as, many have been awarded student of the month, a few students have all As and Bs in their classes, the majority of students are passing 85% of their classes with a C or higher, they are becoming better at self-evaluation and reflection, and they are achieving the goals they set.

fund for the year. This was due to higher salaries and wages. This year was the first in four years that showed an increase in containers moved at the facility. In 2015, the city moved over 1,300 containers. With the bottoming out of oil prices, the count decreased to a low of 82 in 2017. In 2018, the number moved back up to 221, and ended 2019 at 216 containers.

The report also noted that the city's pension fund is fully funded at over 100 percent. The city has prepaid monies to the fund, eliminating the pension liability.

Zervis stated that anyone who has a question or concern about the financial reports can contact him at City Hall. All financial reports are available for review at

City Hall or on the city's website, shafter.com, he said.

In a related presentation, Ken Pun, of the accounting firm The Pun Group, presented a Single Audit Report required for any city that spends over \$750,000 in federal money. The majority of the money, according to Zervis, was for road projects in the city.

"We were very impressed with the reporting, accuracy and transparency of the City of Shafter's financial reports that were prepared," Pun said.

The accountants had no issues or disagreements with the reports that were submitted by the city. "Shafter is in a very strong position financially and has a solid foundation that is fairly and accurately re-

corded," Pun said.

In other city action, the council voted to move forward on using grant allocations for the installation of a \$90,000 outdoor fitness court at Mannel Park.

The fitness court may replace the current beach volleyball court. This court would consist of several exercise stations, and would include an app offered by National Fitness that can be used by participating residents for an overall fitness program. There would be seven different stations that provide a circuit training system providing full body workouts.

The council discussed adding another outdoor fitness court at Veterans Park. This court would have several stations, including having the stations be wheelchair ac-

cessable.

The cost of the additional project would be about \$113,000.

The last item on the agenda was the resurfacing of the competition pool at the Shafter Aquatic Center. The city has only received one bid for the project, by Pool Tek. The company said that they lack the crew size and equipment to complete the project in a timely manner, but can tap resources through partnerships with other contractors in the Los Angeles area.

There is a strict timeline for the project to be completed by January, when the pool would be needed by the Shafter High swim team.

The council authorized a maximum of \$30,000 for the project.

environmental effects of the locally generated alternative, which was developed through city and state collaboration.

The City of Shafter had taken the authority to court as they opposed the original route that was chosen, which it said would have negatively impacted the city and its residents. The city

was successful in its bid to have an alternative route adopted.

The original route would have run parallel to the existing BNSF freight line that already runs through Shafter and intersects in seven different points of the city. The early proposal would have run the train along a similar route but on a raised viaduct, which

would have hindered the city's ability to make future changes to the freight line by essentially creating a barrier.

The section receiving clearance extends from Shafter east towards State Route 99 and the existing railroad tracks, then head south into Bakersfield, ending at a station that will be located on F Street in down-

town Bakersfield.

The authority will be releasing six other remaining documents for public comment, on a schedule to complete the process before a December 2021 deadline.

The next document that will be completed, by January, is expected to cover the section of the project from Bakersfield to Palmdale.
