'The Big Secret' to open

"The Big Secret" will be coming to Shafter later this month. No, the "secret" is not that Shafter is full of talented individuals – that secret has been out ever since a group of Shafter residents decided to celebrate the arts with an annual weekend festival. The secret that is coming is the latest play by Shafter resident, farmer and playwright Larry Starrh.

The play will lead off this year's Colours Festival at Shafter's Ford Theater Feb. 20-23. All performances are at 7:30 p.m. except Sunday, which will be at 2 p.m.

Starrh has entertained audiences during the festival since its inception, delivering a variety of productions.

"The Big Secret" tells the story of Lester, a dirt-poor farmer dealing with the

Keeping the city in shape

Grant helps finish James St. project

Have you ever wondered who is responsible for all of the work that is being done on the city's streets, as well as the sidewalks and buildings in town? The answer is the Shafter Public Works Department.

Director Michael James and his department are responsible for all of the infrastructure in the city, guided by the recommendations of the City Council.

The latest example of their work is the major project just finishing up on James Street. The road was repaved, as well as getting all of the curbs and gutters redone. It was a time-consuming project that took about a year, including the planning and design of the project and completing the work. "We are finishing up the last of the project now, which includes putting accessible corners and sidewalks in," James said.

The majority of the project was the result of a federally funded \$500,000 grant that the city received. When the James Street project was just beginning, James said that it was brought up that a grant available through Kern Council of Governments could fund the project, but it would mean going through the application process and getting authorization for the plans of the project. He said that it

Typically, alcohol comes to mind when thinking about a liquor store. But Los Amigos Liquor has much more than beer, wine and spirits.

The store carries the usual alcohol selections, including "the coldest beer in town," as is boasted on their storefront. However, they also carry a variety of grocery items, with staples like bread, cold cuts, milk and coffee, as well as health and beauty products and party supplies.

Store owner Bharpur Singh Brar opened the store in 2005.

Brar first came to Shafter in 1994 and opened the 97 Cent Store on Central Avenue. Brar then went on to open a "dollar store" right down the street. Brar also owns the building next door to Los Amigos, which is home to La Fonda Restaurant.

Brar and his family tried their hand at the restaurant business in 2010, opening Five Star Pizza. The pizza place had video games, a special room for birthday parties and pool tables.

Brar enjoys the community feeling in Shafter, which was one of the main draws when in deciding to put down roots here.

Wrestlers take down competition at tourney

The Shafter High School junior varsity wrestling team captured second place at the South Sequoia League tournament held at McFarland High School last weekend. All of the Shafter wrestlers placed in the top three in their respective weight divisions.

Shafter ended the tourney with three SSL champions. Mauricio Sanchez went undefeated in the 108 lb. division getting the gold. In the 122lb. division, Zaid Hussein won first place for the Generals. Adan Vargas also was crowned as a league champion after going undefeated in the 184 lb. weight class.

Getting second place finishes for the Generals were Efrain Meza at 122 lb., Logan McGrath at 184lb., and Andrew Galvez in the 128 lb. division. Adrian Arrendondo placed third at 134 lb. and Cesar Cabral captured third at 134 lb.

On the varsity side, there was no league tournaments for Central Section teams this year. All of the teams are divided into six different divisions, with each team sending one wrestler from each weight class to a Valley Championship tournament, with all of them being held this Friday and Saturday at different locations. Shafter is in Division III.

The Division III tournament is Friday and Saturday at North High School. The top seven wrestlers from each weight class will qualify for the Central Section Masters Tournament which will be held the following weekend.

The Shafter Generals varsity team ended its regular season with a narrow defeat to rival Wasco, 34-25. A win against Wasco would have given the Generals a share of the regular season title. A highlight of the night was the presentation that Wasco made to Nicholas Garza's father, Tomas Garza, in support of his son's fight against leukemia.

Garza was diagnosed with the disease earlier this year. Since the diagnosis, the wrestling community has come together to show its support for the junior wrestler.

Shafter will be going against some stiff competition in the Division III tournament, the first year that the section has formatted the post-season in this way. They will be going against teams such as North High, Foothill and Liberty.

weather, the rigors of farming and life with his wife, Ella Mae. Throw into the mix the challenge of raising a daughter who is in love with a missionary to a labor camp, and it becomes a struggle for Lester to balance this work, family and finances. When he and his friend Manny, the local farrier working on horses' hooves, decide to embark on a secret project, they have a remarkable awakening.

The show is about legacies, families, faith and secrets. Everyone has a secret — some are just bigger than others. The play is full of music and unique characters.

Starrh has been a mainstay of the festival since the beginning. He and a group of people believed that Shafter would en-

joy an opportunity to experience different forms of art spread out over a weekend, allowing local residents a chance to display their talents. In addition to farming, Starrh has years of experience in the arts and a degree in musical theater. With the Colours Festival, Starrh and company have brought people together around a love for the arts and provided an opportunity for that love to be expressed in a public arena.

"I found that Kern County has a boatload of talented people, but they spend their days hard at work, often putting their passions for art and music on the back burner," said Starrh. was worth the process and waiting to get the federal funds instead of having to fund the project directly. The result is a much-improved street that didn't cost the city a large amount of money to complete.

James said that the city likes to target at least one project a year that will be locally funded, be it road improvements or other infrastructure projects. "We have been collecting data from public input, as well as our own research, and will be putting a recommendation to the council soon regarding our next project."

One ongoing project for the department is relocating the majority of their equipment and supplies to the new City Yard, located on Commerce Way, next to the Shafter CCF facility. The city acquired 18 acres of land previously used by Global Fabricators. James said that it is a very large chunk of land, but the property is working out well for the city.

In the first phase, the city's engineers and GIS Department personnel were relocated to the new location. This move has alleviated the need for space at the City Hall buildings. They still use the City Yard on North Shafter, but will eventually be moved completely out to the new yard. The new yard is right next to the city's largest and most productive water well, and the parking lot that exists now between the correctional


facility and the City Yard will have a covered parking structure installed with solar panels, which will power the well and the building.

An issue that is being addressed also is the ongoing improvements to the North Shafter area. "We are now looking at shoulder improvements options for the section of Highway 43 near Fresno Avenue to the city," said James. He said that they are working with Caltrans on finding the feasibility of the different options that are available to them to make the shoulders safer for residents as they walk into town from North Shafter.

The department is also in talks with Caltrans on the possibility of a roundabout for the intersection of Los Angeles, Santa Fe Way and Highway 43. "The area can get very congested at certain times of the day, displaying the need for something to be installed to alleviate the congestion," James said.

He said that in studies done by the department, as well as talking to different cities that have installed roundabouts, suggest that the installation would probably benefit more from that type of intersection rather than a traffic light. He said that this project is in its infancy and would be a couple of years down the road, due to the research and designs that go into that type of project.

In a move that is aimed at making the

city's geographical maps and information more accessible to the public, the Geographical Information Systems Department has worked hard, led by GIS Coordinator Chris Schultz, in putting this information online. "If someone wants to know if their property is in the city limits, or want to know where different zoned areas are located, they can go to the city's website and get that information," said Schultz.

If you go to the city's website and go to

City Departments, down at the bottom of the options is GIS, which is Geographical Information Systems. This tab will take you to maps and information such as what street sweeping schedule your neighborhood is on, or trash collection, as well as maps of the Gossamer Grove community, the Wonderful Logistics Park and a map of the Shafter City Core. More information is available from the Public Works Department at 661-746-5002.





Then, the story was told through physical actions, facial expressions and the accompanied organ music that set the tone for the movie and did an important part in telling the story. The festival will have a nationally acclaimed organist that will be accompanying the silent movies being played. Bill Campbell will be supplying the music for "A Night in the Show," starring Charlie Chaplin, and "Sherlock Jr.," starring Buster Keaton. The shows will be presented at the Congregational Bible Church, 430 E. Tulare Ave., on Thursday, Feb. 20, and Saturday, Feb. 22, from 7:30 to 9 p.m. The "Night in the Show" follows Chaplin as Mr. Pest, as her tries to find a suitable theater seat before winding up in a fight with the conductor. He is thrown out. Hilarity ensues as Chaplin has run-ins with a variety of characters including patrons, a harem dancer

and a fire-eater.

"Sherlock Jr." is Keaton at his best. Keaton is a film projectionist who longs to be a detective. He gets his chance when he is framed for stealing his girlfriend's father's pocketwatch.

The films would not have nearly as much impact without the accompaniment of the organist. Campbell is currently the organist for the Paramount Iceland Skating Rink in southern California. His weekly performances draw hundreds of people.

He is an active member of the American Theater Organ Society. He started his career while still in high school in Milwaukee, playing the organ for the Avalon Theater. He was the movie organist and played weekends before some of the era's most famous films such as "The Longest Yard," "Tommy, the Exorcist" and "Titanic." His musical preludes to the movies

include selections from the movies whenever possible.

Campbell's theater organ career experience extends from concerts in New York, the Coronado Theater in Rockford, Ill., and Milwaukee's Dairyland Theater Organ Society.

When Campbell's full-time career as a computer professional changed and he moved to the West Coast, he continued to perform. These performances included stints at the Orange County Theater Organ Society in South Pasadena and the Trinity Facility in San Diego. In all of his concerts, Bill likes to present a variety of music from different time periods that reflect the music history of America.

Campbell loves performing a variety of music on the organ, but one of his first loves is the accompaniment of the silent movies. "The music helps bring the movies to life and tell a story," he says.
