# Richland schools end mask mandate

Beginning March 11, masks will be recommended but not mandated at the Richland School District.

Superintendent Rosa Romero sent a letter to parents regarding the change. Gov. Gavin Newsom recently announced he was updating the policy for mask wearing indoors for public schools.

“Mask wearing is still strongly recommended and is an option for every student or staff member who wishes to wear one at any time,” Romero said in the letter.

She said masks will be available for staff and students who request them. Romero also said that they are transitioning from the pandemic response into a new chapter

where they can use more routine disease control tactics.

The letter goes on to say that it is still recommended to use common sense and focus on personal responsibility and respect.

“One should not make assumptions regarding someone’s beliefs or health status based upon their choice to wear or not wear a mask, nor should they comment on them,” she said.

Romero said protocols will still be followed after March 11 which includes weekly testing for unvaccinated people, as well as contact tracing. They also said students and staff should continue to remain home when sick, are encouraged to take a covid-19 test if exhibiting symptoms, and if they have been exposed to the virus.

Romero said she appreciates the community’s patience and cooperation.

# Wasco Affordable Housing helping residents since 2001

Wasco Affordable Housing, Inc. is a 501(c)3 nonprofit created to provide the community with “decent, safe, and sanitary” housing for persons and families of low and moderate incomes.

The organization has developed 493 affordable housing units in Wasco and Lost Hills.

“The rental rates in Kern County have skyrocketed, making it more difficult for lower-income households to pay rents,” Executive Director Antonio Hernandez said.

Hernandez has been with Wasco

# Pool, parks to get improvements with grant

The city of Shafter is receiving a grant from the state of California that will mean a new life for the Shafter Aquatic Center, as well as improvements to its parks in the city.

The Clean California grant, which the city applied for at the end of 2021, will give the city assistance in getting the Shafter

recreation department operated the pool, including its maintenance, booking, and staffing. With the agreement ended, the city had no resources to operate the pool, forcing the city to abandon the facility until an agreement could be reached on future plans for the building.

The Shafter Recreation District ended its agreement with the city, in which the pool and Aquatic Center has been uninhabitable for the past two years, with the pool being drained and suffering damage, as well as to the surrounding landscaping and buildings.

The Shafter Recreation District ended its agreement with the city, in which the

recreation department operated the pool, including its maintenance, booking, and staffing. With the agreement ended, the city had no resources to operate the pool, forcing the city to abandon the facility until an agreement could be reached on future plans for the building.

The community voiced their concerns, with residents speaking at City Council meetings about the importance of the pool

and the damage the absence of the pool had caused. The high school team had no place to practice, as well as the local swim club, the Shafter Stingrays, forcing parents to either have their kids not able to swim or to swim for different clubs.

After discussions, an agreement could not be reached, with the site looking more abandoned by the month, making the future





# Superintendent discusses budget and covid-19

Wasco Union Elementary School District Superintendent Kelly M. Richers recently reviewed the status of the budget, the covid-19 pandemic and an item from their monthly board meeting.

According to Richers, there is just below \$50 million in their regular budget for all of their staff and to cover operating expenses this year. These include salaries, insurance, retirement, facility maintenance, vehicles and other costs. Food services are not considered because it is a separate department overseen by the federal government.

For the next several years, the district has an additional \$48 million to spend on "pet projects" from Gov. Gavin Newsom. Some of which are ongoing and most of which are not.

"None of this money is usable for teachers, and staff raises, which is a shame be-

cause that is where we need the money most," Richers said. "The challenges are finding qualified people to fill positions."

Part of the \$48 million will be used for covid-19 relief and offer more student hour days.

"The governor wants to expand school responsibility for children to 9 hours every day. Right now, it is about 7 1/2 hours," he said.

Students are in school from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., the standard maximum time.

The money would also be used for universal transitional kindergarten for 4-year-olds, music programs, special education and other categorized elements.

Funding from the \$48 million is to allocate \$21 million for covid relief, \$1 million for covid-19 expanded learning, \$1 million for teacher training and \$2.5 million for

special education. Everything else goes into other minor programs.

Almost all students are back in school as

of March 1.

"Throughout the entire district, we have fewer than 10 exposures or positive cases," Richers said.

The board recently approved a resolution so Richers can write a letter to Newsom to not mandate child and staff vaccination. The letter will be sent to Newsom, Assembly member Salas, Senator Hurtado, Kern County Public Health Director Bryn Carrigan and County Superintendent of Schools Mary Barlow.

"This is coming from two proposed Senate bills. In their bills, they would not permit any medical or religious exemptions. That is a problem, and I am working on trying to get that not to happen," Richers said. "Most of what they want to do at the state level regarding schools is not good for us. Core education funding was a priority for Governor Brown; it is not for Governor Newsom."

"Wasco Bengals is a nonprofit organization with a mission to keep our kids off the streets and participating in activities that not only teach them a sport, but also help them develop life skills they can take into their adulthood and beyond," Wasco Bengals Cheer Representative Cynthia Torres said. "Throughout the course of the season, it is incredible to see these girls blossom. It takes much courage to perform in front of a large crowd, and this builds self-confidence instilling in them a belief that they can accomplish anything. They learn to be responsible, respectful and on time while dedicated to their school work. It is amazing to see how passionate they become."

The cheer clinic is an open-mat cheer-leading practice that allows interested participants to better prepare for tryouts and meet current cheerleaders.

"It is a great way for the girls to become acclimated with the cheer environment and practice before they have to try out," Cheer Advisor for the Varsity squad Ruth Loza said. "The best thing about the clinic is seeing the girls excited to be out there learning and working with their coaches. One needs to make at least one day of the clinics to participate in tryouts. However, we encourage that they attend both days as one day they learn the cheer and the other day they learn the dance routine."

In 2020 and 2022, the Varsity Wasco Bengals represented Wasco in Las Vegas, winning first place national championship titles.

"That is a testament to how hard they worked. They were so happy to return home

wearing their Jamz National Championship jackets," Loza said.

As soon as a cheerleader graduates eighth grade and moves on to their freshman high school year, they can become coaches for the younger girls.

"In this sense, they are giving back to the community and sharing what they learned. It is a great experience for them and something they can use on their resumes for jobs and college," Loza said. "The program would not run without the coaches. We have coaches in their high school years, with some in college. It is all volunteer work, and we couldn't do it without them. They put their hearts and souls into teaching."


The team is run on support from their sponsors.

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# Delano man arrested in series of shootings

A Delano man has been arrested in connection with two separate shootings in Wasco including an attempted murder case, the Kern County Sheriff's Office reported. Deputies identified Brayan Morales, 20, on March 3 as a suspect involved in a shooting on Dec. 27, 2021 near the intersection of Broadway and 15th Street, deputies said in a press release.

In addition to the offenses committed on Dec. 27, 2021, Morales was also identified as a suspect involved in the attempted murder and attempted robbery which occurred in the 900 Block of 8th Street on Feb. 9. During the investigation, Morales was found to be in possession of the weapon believed to have been used in both crimes,

deputies said. Morales was arrested in the 100 block of 12th Avenue in Delano and booked into the Central Receiving Facility for assault with a deadly weapon - a firearm, participation in a criminal street gang, possession of a firearm by a gang member, conspiracy to commit a felony by a gang member, and conspiracy in relation to the incident on Dec. 27. Morales was also charged with attempt-

ed murder, attempted robbery, participation in a criminal street gang, possession of a firearm by a gang member, conspiracy to commit a felony by a gang member, and conspiracy in relation to the incident on Feb. 9. Investigations into both incidents are ongoing, and anyone with additional information is asked to contact the Kern County Sheriff's Office at 661-861-3110 or Secret Witness at 661-322-4040.

# Mayor holds forum to address increase in crime

"The meeting was organized because there is a rise in crime here in our city; some of it is violent crime. Residents are concerned that not enough is being done about it," Mayor Gilberto Reyna said. "Recently, we have had more shootings which is something that didn't happen before or was very rare. People are really on edge about that, and they have the right to be.

With this forum, we explored ways that we can all be involved to diminish this wave of crime." "Crime prevention is difficult sometimes," Kern County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Specialist Lori Meza said. "It takes a lot more community partnerships for us to carry out proactive law enforcement." Meza talked about community-orientated policing.

"I don't want you to think you have to police. I know the term can be a little misleading, but that is not what we are asking you to do," Meza said. "It is a strategy of policing that focuses on developing relationships with community members. That means that law enforcement still has to do the policing, but we rely on relationships." She discussed the importance of establishing Neighborhood Watch groups. "We need people to be our eyes and ears. We want community members to get involved by reporting crimes and working closely with the sheriff so that we can have a positive impact on the crime that we are having," Meza said. A Neighborhood Watch is a group of citizens who come together to reduce crimes in a specific area. The core reasons for the increase in crime are multipronged. "The problems are laws of this state," Kern County District Attorney Cynthia Zimmer said. "Some laws have been passed in California that has decreased the amount of consequence that people involved with crime suffer." Reyna agreed some of the recent laws are an issue.

"These laws, in my opinion, allow criminals to think they can get away with it. Some of these laws, like Senate Bill 81 and 483, have removed criminal enhancements that have resulted in less prison time for offenders and makes it more difficult to add a longer sentence," Reyna said. "Even so, I want you to know that we are working very hard to do what we can to protect you. It is our number one priority, but we need to think carefully about whom we vote for," Zimmer said. Kern County Supervisor for the 4th District David Couch said local officials need to fight Sacramento. "We need to talk to our legislators strenuously about how they vote on these particular bills. It is important whom you vote for, but you also have to hold their feet to the fire when they get into office," Couch said. "We need neighborhood watch groups. I encourage all of you to go home and talk to your neighbors and get in contact with Meza to create your own." City Manager Scott Hurlbert encouraged residents to work together with officials. "We need to work together to keep moving forward. We can't give up. It is common

for us to be frustrated. I would encourage you to channel that frustration, not to anger at us or the others serving the community, but if you have an idea, share it, and grab a hold of the neighborhood watch groups," Hurlbert said. "The community has asked why we don't have our own police department, and the mayor and council have done several studies on this. It is expensive to run. Almost twice as much per year that we are paying for our sheriff's contract." Hurlbert said it is still a goal. "Having our own police department is still the goal, and I think about it daily. It might take an increase by 1% on sales tax, and it is my job to figure that out," he said. Kern County Sheriff's Office Wasco Substation Sgt. Charles Shinn said deputies are doing everything they can. "We are doing everything we can and are committed to working in partnership with the community to strengthen our safety and security," Shinn said. Reyna said he plans to continue the conversation. "I want you to know we will have more of these town hall meetings so that we can be in communication and see the progress," Reyna said.

of the pool to be in danger.

The grant is worth almost \$5 million, with a projected \$2.4 million of the money to be used for the improvements on the pool.

According to Public Works Director Michael James, the money will be used to get the pool operational again. This means improvements to the pool itself, surfacing, getting the children's and adult pools open again.

"The surrounding buildings and landscaping will not be included in the grant money. It will be to get the pool operational again, and perhaps getting the pool area equipped for ADA compliance," James said.

"I can't see the city not having a pool. I have so many great memories of the Shafter Pool. I would be heartbroken if my kids didn't get a chance to have these same great memories," said Kelly Rhinehold, who said his kids are looking forward to getting a

chance to swim in the rehabbed pool.

In addition to the Shafter Aquatic Center, the grant money will be used for improvements on the city's existing parks.

Veterans Park will be getting a lighted walking path. Mannel Park will be receiving a new interior lighting system and some electrical improvements. The Veterans Park project is estimated at \$175,000 and Mannel Park at \$390,000.

James said a little over \$1 million dollars will be spent on a James Street improvement project. This means a new parking lot at Stringham Park, new lighting and decorations on the sidewalks and streets from Lerdo Highway and Shafter Avenue. It will also include a shaded seating area at Stringham Park.

The existing Skate Park for Shafter, off of Euclid Avenue near the Shafter Youth Center will be getting \$770,000 for improvements to the facility. Originally, the equipment at the Skate Park were supposed

to be temporary until permanent equipment could be installed. The site didn't get the necessary improvements and has suffered a similar fate as the Shafter pool, with the area going unkempt for a long period of

time. The money will be used to install new equipment at the park, as well as lighting.

There is not a firm timeline for the projects at the moment. There will be more specific details as they become available.

Affordable Housing since 2006. Before that, he worked for the City of Wasco Housing Authority between 2003-2006, totaling 19 years of affordable housing experience.

"We build high-quality homes that are

well maintained. Our developments are all thoroughly kept, and we take great pride in that," he said.

The United States Department of Agriculture subsidizes their projects; tenants pay only 30% of their monthly income as rent. The rents range between \$640 - \$870 per month for those who do not qualify for rental assistance.

All units come furnished with a stove, refrigerator and washer/dryer hookups. Properties include a playground, community building, and BBQ areas.

"I believe the biggest challenge is the lack of affordable housing available and the need for providing more. Every day people come to us asking for housing. It is hard when we don't have many vacancies because we want to house everyone who asks for it," Hernandez said.

The most important thing to qualify for their housing is submitting an application to be placed on the waiting list. Besides the traditional rental history background check, households must meet state and federal income levels to be eligible. To prove this, documents include pay-stubs, tax returns, if applicable, social security benefits letters, child support income, and disability and welfare verification.

Some of the apartments they have developed are El Mirage on Poplar Ave., Sunset Villa on Palm Ave. and Beckes Street Housing on Spruce Ave. They also developed

Rosaleda Village, where farm labor housing complex residents were relocated.

"Every development is a great accomplishment for Wasco Affordable Housing, and we are proud of every one of them. However, I am most proud of our senior development on Central Ave.," Hernandez said. "It was developed in 2008 and was nationally recognized by the USDA."

A picture of the development is found at the Washington DC National Office and was also the first USDA farm labor development for seniors built in the United States.

"We are in the preliminary stages of building a new senior development," he added.

"We are successful because we have a strong board that works together as a team to find solutions and generate ideas; and foremost, our support staff. I want the community to know we are here for them and are here to help," Hernandez said.

- Broken bones of the wrist, hand, ankle, or foot that have no obvious need to reset and have not broken the skin

## WHEN SHOULD YOU GO TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM

- Broken bones and dislocated joints that need to be reset or have broken the skin
- Deep cuts that require stitches - especially in the face
- Head or eye injuries
- Severe flu or cold symptoms
- High fevers
- Fevers with rash
- Fevers in infants
- Fainting or loss of consciousness
- Severe pain, particularly in the abdomen or starting halfway down the back
- Bleeding that won't stop or a large open wound
- Vaginal bleeding with pregnancy
